## McKenzie-Smith places fourth at North Halton track meet

McKenzie-Smith placed fourth overall and Brookville sixth at the North Halton senior public schools annual track and field championships held Wednesday and Thursday at Acton High School.

McKenzie-Smith claimed fourth place in the Junior and Senior divisions and Fifth in the Intermediate class.

Brookville counted a fifth place finish in Senior and sixth in both Junior and Intermediate.

Five individual marks were broken by athletes from Georgetown and Milton area schools.

At the North Halton relays Thursday McKenzie-Smith grabbed fourth place finishes and two fifth place.

McKenzie-Smith's Gretchen Lathrop was first and Eileen Richards third in senior girls shot put.

Al Higgins placed third for McKenzie-Smith in the senior boys 80 metres hurdles and John Gardener was third in the 800 metres.

Adrienne Kovacs finished fifth in the 1,500 metres for senior girls for McKenzie-Smith and Frances Chisholm of Brookville placed sixth in the senior girls triple jump.

Mark Ruppert of McKenzie-Smith was tops in Intermediate boys shot put while Lindsey Anderson took fifth for Brookville.

McKenzie-Smith's Steve Wagner was first in the intermediate boys triple jump and Craig Wrobel of Brookville second.

In the senior girls 80 metres hurdles Brookville's Evelyn Stokes was fifth and Brookville athletes Donna Beamish and Val Taylor were fifth and sixth respectively in the 100 metres. Beamish was third in the 200 metres and Kathy Kolozsvari placed third in the 400 metres. Sixth in the 800 metres

went to Lisa Gillies of McKenzie-Smith.

Brookville's Beamish was second in the senior girls long jump and Sonja Armstrong came sixth in the same event for McKenzie-Smith.

In senior girls high jump Andrea Williams of Brookville was fourth and Karen Knatt of McKenzie-Smith sixth.

Brookville's Denise Kennedy was fourth in intermediate girls shot put and Tili Jago of McKenzie-Smith fifth. Sharon Kruk, Brookville was fifth in triple jump.

Mark Boynton was fourth for Brookville in the 800 metres and fifth in the 200 metres. McKenzie-Smith's Ted Moyses placed sixth in the high jump for intermediate boys.

Craig Wrobel, Brookville, placed fourth in long jump and Brian Flindall, McKenzie-Smith, sixth.

In the intermediate boys 100 metres Steve Wagner from McKenzie-Smith, was fourth. McKenzie-Smith athletes Spencer Smith and Steve Morris captured second and fourth respectively in the junior boys 60 metres while Tom Atherton was fourth in high jump and David Paul third in the 800 metres. Paul Kirkpatrick placed fourth in the long jump and 200 metres for McKenzie-Smith.

Brookville's Brian Acheson came third in the junior boys 60 metres while Josh Death was sixth in long jump. Acheson also placed third in the 200 metres.

Top spot in the junior boys 60 metres hurdles was captured by Daryl Bartlett of McKenzie-Smith.

The junior boys shot put crown went to Spencer Smith, McKenzie-Smith, while another athlete from the same school, Tom

Atherton, was tops in triple jump. Mike Cunningham, McKenzie-Smith, was sixth in triple jump and Brookville's Tim Wood placed fifth in shot put.

Brookville's Denise Kennedy placed sixth in intermediate girls high jump and Sandi Boynton was fifth in long jump.

Brenda Skenbor, Brookville, claimed third place in the 800 metres and Eilidh McLellan fifth in the intermediate girls 60 metre hurdles.

McKenzie-Smith's Melanie Johnston came in sixth in the 600 metres for intermediate girls.

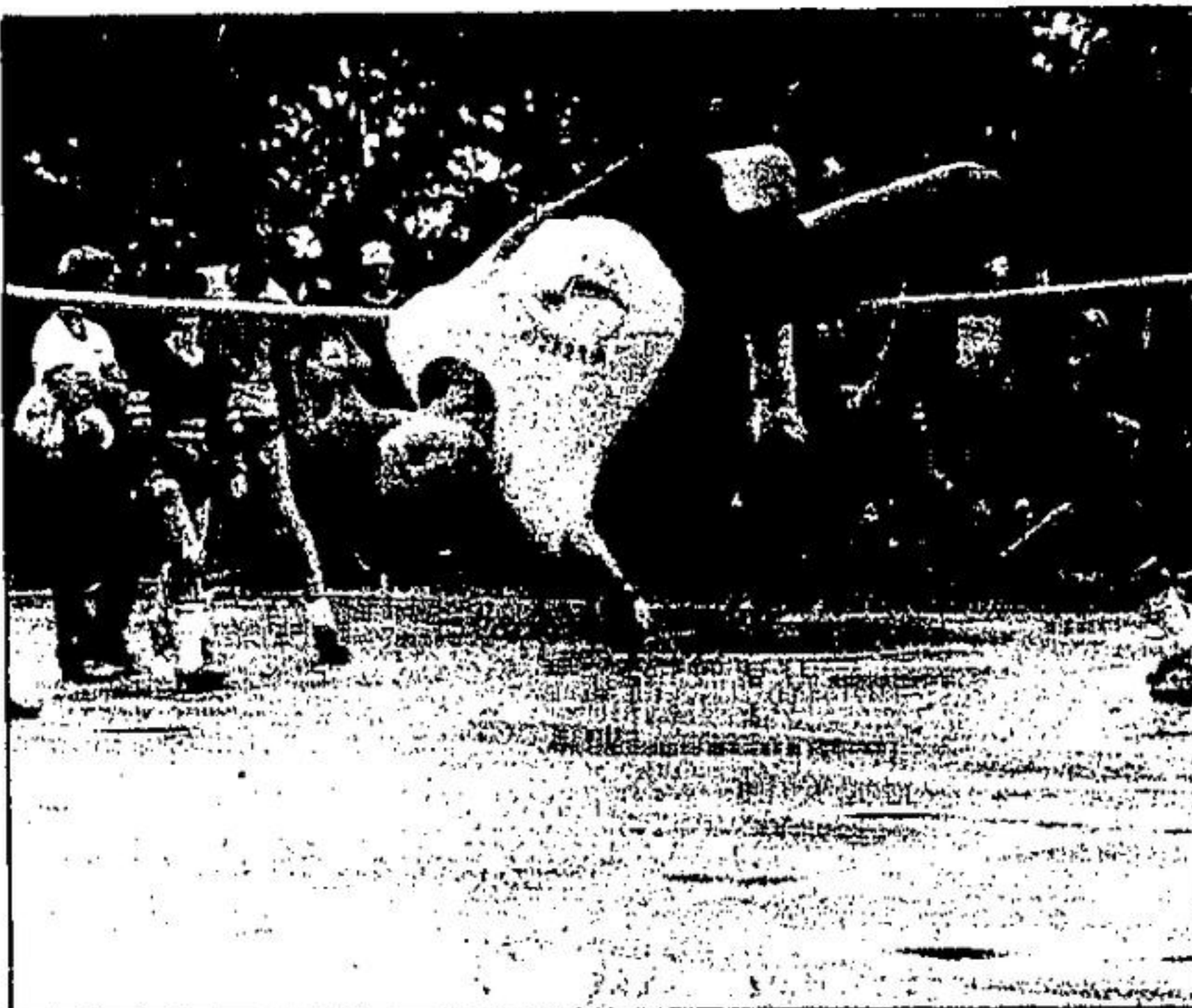
Stewart Hoy and Derek Boyle, both from
