Newsletter costs worry trustees

The cost and method of distribution are standing in the way of a Halton Board of Education semi-annual newsletter.

Thursday night the Board discussed the possibility of the twice yearly report as a method of improving communications between the board and the community.

Burlington trustee Noel Cooper insisted the letter be sent to all taxpayers and not just those with children. He suggested there be a method of distribution which would ensure all residents of Halton receive it.

Director of Education Em Lavender noted there are 79,000 households in Halton, and the cost of mailing would be \$4,028. Going by the production cost of a similar Calgary newsletter, it will be an additional \$2,500 to have it printed.

Janis Millman, our Oakville trustee, suggested it not be distributed as junk mail. A report on the various costs is to be brought back to the board by August 27.
