Pool demos offered

The Water Safety Awareness program offered to backyard pool owners in Halton Hills this summer is off to a good start. This is an Experience '81 program, sponsored by the Halton Hills Recreation and Parks Department and the Ministry of Culture and Recreation.

The purposes of this program are to determine what knowledge the backyard pool owners have about the safety of their own pools, and to supply any information the pool owners might request. This information is being gathered by two water safety technicians, Cayley Gresswell and Dan Stewart, who will also be doing FREE backyard pool demonstrations upon request at any backyard pool.

The pool demonstrations can be done at any time and include such things as, first aid, artificial respiration, treatment of a spinal

injury, and possible rescues in your own pool.

So far the results have been very good. Approximately one hundred pool owners in Georgetown and Acton have filled out our questionnaire, with 60 per cent wanting a pool demonstration. The majority of people have

been very co-operative and willing to take a few minutes to answer the questionnaire.
