Jelinek continues strike petition

Even though the postal strike is over, Halton MP Otto Jelinek isn't giving up his drive to make the disgruntled voice of his constituents heard in Ottawa on the issue of essential services strikes.

So far, he has collected over 10,000 signatures calling for the inside postal workers to be legislated back to work. He believes it is wrong now to "cheer" the end of the postal strike and expect all the problems are solved.

Jelinek wants to take his petition to Ottawa next week and, with his colleagues, start a campaign to force the government to ban essential services strikes, including the post office. He also wants legislation requiring 51 per cent of a union's membership to vote before they can go out on strike and sector bargaining; all post office, airport, etc. employees bargain together and not as several separate unions. "Now is the time to solve our long term labor problems in the post office," Jelinek declared.

His petitions will be a "symbol of the discontent" of his constituents. Despite the end of the strike petitions are still pouring in and he expects to collect 20,000 names.

Sixteen petition coupons from last week's Free Press were turned in despite the fact the strike ended just a little over a day after it was published. Only a few came in after the strike was settled. Jelinek distributed petitions to stores all over town Thursday and many signatures are on those.

While the wording is obsolete now, Jelinek says the "message" of the petition is still valid. He encourages all Acton residents who were upset by the strike to send in petition coupons to the Free Press or sign a petition in a store.

He will be picking them up later this week.

New financing spurs building on dragstrip

The 140 acre former dragstrip land, approved for estate residential homes four years ago, may finally have homes built upon it.

New financing in Lyncean Investments Limited has made the project possible.

The approval for the 53 lots, each more than two acres, has lapsed, so the company applied to have the same approved draft plan recirculated, and to seek the Town's support at the Region.

Halton Hills council passed a motion advising the Region they support the draft plan of subdivision, with a few minor revisions.

The main road through the area runs from the Fifth to the Sixth Line, with loop roads north and south, joining it.

The land lies north of Highway 7, on Lot 29.

New name better reflects work of Acton Community Services Centre

The Acton Community Services Centre is in the process of changing its name to the Acton Social Services and Information Centre.

While the name hasn't been officially changed by the board of directors yet, co-ordinator Peggie Balkind said the centre has been operating under its new name since last month.

A new brochure has the new name on it, but the letterhead hasn't been changed yet.

The new name better reflects what the centre actually does and staff was receiving calls from people wanting to reach the arena, the Acton Community Centre.

After the centre received its grant from the region this year a region staffer sent the board a letter suggesting the name be changed to reflect regional funding. Later the region dropped the request, though it was a factor since it got the staff and board thinking about adopting a name which better reflects its functions.

The centre was born in the spring of 1976 and runs Meals on Wheels and Block Parents programs. The following agencies, mostly regional, are involved with the centre: Health Unit, North Halton Mental Health Clinic, Family Counselling, Children's Aid, Day Care, Welfare, Addiction Research Foundation, Halton Alcohol and Drug Addiction Program, Halton Helping Hands, Halton Housing Authority, Halton Hills Community Legal Clinic, Probation and Parole, Probation and Aftercare services and Volunteer Bureau.

Agencies hold meetings with clients at the centre and centre staff provides information about various agency services. The centre also publishes a list of all social service agencies and phone numbers.

Transportation service for emergencies is available through the centre on a limited basis and in February the centre holds income tax clinics.
