





### Check Your Antifreeze In Summer, Too

Checking the effectiveness of your antifreze/ summer coolant is simple, says Tim Tierney, director of technical services for the Automotive Parts & Accessories Association. Here's how:

Refere the engine is started in the morning and while it is still cold, remove the radiator cap, stick your finger into the filter neck of the radiator and rub it around. The coolant should look clean and the neck should be free from rust and other deposits.

Also check for the proper mixture of coolant and water, using a coolant tester available in most stores and departments selling automotive products. A 30-50 mix of coolant and water gives adequate believer protection to 265°F, with a 15 in radiator cap.

### Twilight Driving

Dawn and dusk-with their dim and diffused light—can be especially dangerous for motor-ists, the National Safety Council notes. Nonreflective and shadowy areas become obscure. It can be difficult to see unlighted traffic signs and road markings, as well as cyclists and pedestrians.

Don't be reluctant to turn on your car lights. even though the sun is up, it may help your

Also, clean your windshield before driving in the twilight; a dirty windshield amplifies glare; and reduces overall vision.






