## Obituary

### Audrey Bilton

A former Rockwood village trustee and active community-minded resident, Audrey Bilton died suddenly at her home in Rockwood on Monday, August 3. She was 42-years-old.

Born Audrey Florence Grundy she was the daughter of the late George and Florence Grundy of Ospringe. She attended Ospringe Public School, SS 13 and Erin District High School. She was a member of the Presbyterian Church.

On April 27, 1957, she married Gordon Bilton and they moved into a home they built on Puslinch Lake. They moved to Rockwood 20 years ago, where she became a member of the local Presbyterian church.

Her community-awareness was proven with the many activities she took part in in the village. A few years ago she served as a Rockwood village trustee, and was on the Ladies' Auxiliary of the Presbyterian Church.

She has also been very active in her community selling Avon. She sold Watkins Products, and ceramics all from her home. In November of each year, Mrs. Bilton held an open house for all kinds of products. Dealers came and sold their products.

Mrs. Bilton also helped in the family business clerking for her brother at Grundy's Furniture and Auction Centre at Ospringe, and with Max Storey, Gord

Funeral service was held Friday at McIntyre and Wilkie Funeral Home, Guelph, with Rev. Carrie Doehring and Miss Terry Anthony her assistant, of Rockwood Presbyterian Church officiating.
