With the help of Acton Sabres Jr. B coach Jules Russiani, Murray has been asked to go for a tryout with the Minnesota North Stars organization.

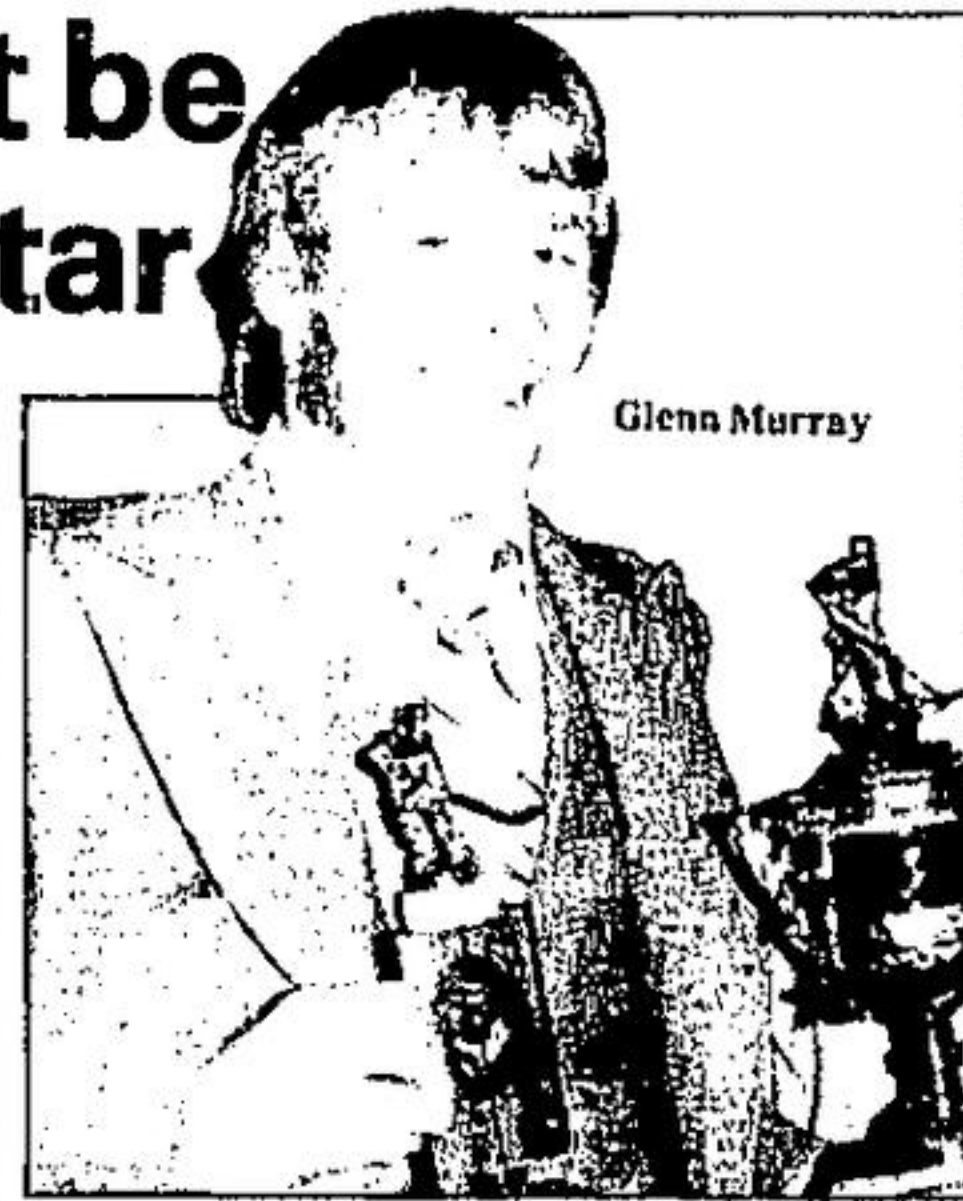
