Traffic survey helps planning

Ministry of Transportation and Communication employees have been busy conducting a traffic study on Highway 25 a few miles north of town this week.

Bob Cook, field supervisor explains that the study is done over a 12 hour period, on request of various provincial government departments. In this case, he said, they are covering the Eastern Wellington county boundaries, but the department and reason for the study, are vague as in most cases. Crews were out for six hours Monday, and six hours Tuesday.

As many vehicles as possible are stopped and asked such questions as where they are going, where they are coming from, and how often they make that trip. About one to one and a half minutes of the drivers' time is taken up, and no one is obligated to answer the questions. Exact addresses are requested because the province is divided up into small squares and trips are pinpointed. Names are not taken, and nobody is stopped more than twice.

The amount of people stopped depends on the weather, Cook said. They do not go out in inclement weather, and their part of the study usually lasts from April to September. That way university and college students can be hired to do the job. The number of those stopping traffic depends on the locality.

The surveyers usually stay in hotels or motels close to their project. That way, Cook said, local restaurants and inns are given the benefit of their business.

Crews travel across the province doing these studies, which Cook said essentially helps plan the future of the roads. Exact reasons for various projects are not given.

Cook's crew does not tabulate their data collected, but merely hand them in to another department at Queen's

No GO buses to the CNE

For the first time since GO Transit came to Acton in 1976 there is no express GO service to the CNE.

GO spokesman Tom Henry said this week the Acton to the Ex buses were cancelled this year because there was just "no market at all." Despite a big push last year to lure Actonians onto the GO buses to the CNE "ridership was not good. We couldn't justify the service anymore."

He said the easiest way for Acton residents to get to the Ex using GO Transit is to drive to the bus stop at Moore Park Plaza on the west side of Georgetown.

Buses leave for the Port Credit GO Train station and the ride to the Ex at 9.40, 10.40, 11.40 a.m. and 12.40 p.m. daily. There is an extra bus at 8.40 a.m. Saturdays.

Henry said passengers can take the GO bus from Acton and get to the CNE, but not without some lengthy waits at Moore Park. A bus leaves Acton at 8.45, arriving at Moore park at 9 a.m. with a connection to the Ex at 9.40 a.m. Passengers could also leave Acton at 11.45, arrive in Georgetown at noon and take the 12.40 bus to the CNE.

Returning home the GO trains leave for Port Credit and connecting bus to Georgetown hourly from 6.40 p.m. to 12.45 a.m. Passengers could arrive at Moore Park and leave for Acton at 9.55 p.m.

Cost from Acton to the

CNE and back is \$7.60 single or \$13.75 for a family of up to five, one of whom must be 18 years of age and older.
