

CLASS 26 HOLSTEINS

1. Bull born in 1980. From dam with at least one completed record with a minimum B.C.A. of 130 for milk. FOR AYRSHIRES, DUAL PURPOSE SHORTHORNS AND JERSEYS ONLY.

2. Female, Junior Heifer, born October 1st, 1980 to April 30, 1981. From a dam with at least one record with a minimum of 120 B.C.A. for milk.

3. Female, Intermediate Heifer, born May 1st, 1980 to September 30th, 1980. From a dam with at least one record with a minimum B.C.A. of 120 for milk.

4. Female, Senior Heifer, born October 1st, 1979 to April 30th, 1980. From a dam with at least one record with a minimum of 120 B.C.A. for milk. FOR HOLSTEINS ONLY.

5. Dry Cow—At least one record with a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk. An animal shown in this class cannot be shown in any other class for single animals, or the best udder class, but may be shown in the "Breeder's Herd." On day of the show, must be at least 270 days since last calving. Cow must be recorded in the owner's Record Book as dry on the day of judging. Ribbon Class.

6. Female, Two Year Old, born January 1st, 1979 to September 30, 1979. In milk, dry, or not yet calved for first time. Must be either from a dam with at least one record with a minimum B.C.A. of 120 for milk or the exhibit must have attained a production record equivalent to a minimum B.C.A. of 120 for milk.

7. Female, Three Year Old, Born in 1978. In milk or dry. If dry must be within 8 weeks of calving. Must be either from a dam with at least one record with a minimum B.C.A. of 120 for milk, or the exhibit must have attained a production record equivalent to a minimum B.C.A. of 120 for milk. If the exhibit itself has a production record, it must qualify on its own merits.

8. Female, Four years old, born in 1977. In milk or dry. If dry, must be within approximately 8 weeks of calving. At least one record with a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk.

9. Female, Five Years Old, born in 1976. In milk or dry. If dry, must be within approximately 8 weeks of calving. At least one record with a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk.

10. Female, Mature Cow, born prior to 1976. In milk or dry. If dry, must be within approximately 8 weeks of calving. At least one record with a minimum B.C.A. of 125 for milk.

11. Breeders Herd (Bred and owned by exhibitor. Group of 4 animals, but not more than one bull. Each animal in the group must have been exhibited in one of the classes for single animals. The registration certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as "breeder" and as "owner"—in both cases either as an individual or in partnership. In other words, the exhibitor may be a "joint owner" of an animal and/or the "joint breeder" of an animal. All the animals must be from one farm or breeding unit.

12. BEST UDDER CLASS—Judge shall designate best two udders in classes 8, 9 and 10. These designated exhibits shall compete for first and second best udders in the show. Prize money is paid on 1st and 2nd placings only.

BEST JERSEY HERD—Indian Garden Farms will award a Challenge Trophy to the best Jersey Breeders' Herd.

BEST DUAL PURPOSE SHORTHORN HERD—Bank of Montreal, Acton will award a Challenge Trophy to the Best Dual Purpose Shorthorn Breeders' Herd.

BEST UDDERED COW—The Ken Murray Family will award a Challenge Trophy to the Best Uddered Cow at Acton Fair.

BEST HOLSTEIN TWO-YEAR-OLD—Anthony Acres Holsteins will award a Challenge Trophy to the Best Holstein two-year-old.

SUPREME CHAMPION DAIRY FEMALE—Penson Farm Equipment Ltd., Georgetown, will donate a banner to the Supreme Champion Dairy Female at the 1981 Acton Fall Fair.

HERDSMAN AWARD—Brookville Veterinary Clinic, Brookville, will award a Challenge Trophy for the most attractive presentation and showmanship at the 1981 Acton Fall Fair of a Dairy Herd, consisting of 5 or more animals. This competition is open to 4-H Clubs competing at the Fair.
