RULES AND INFORMATION:

1. Entries to be placed by 11 a.m. Friday.
2. Entry fee 10% of prize money won.
3. All entries to be work of exhibitor and exhibitor only.
4. Decision of the judges shall be final and the judges may withhold any award if in their opinion the exhibit is not worthy.
5. No more, no less, than the number of stalks, blooms or plants specified may be entered in a class.
6. Any bud showing colour is classed as one bloom.
7. All exhibits must be in suitable containers to prevent tipping when handled by judges or committee.
8. No stem wiring permitted.
9. All due care will be taken, but no responsibility will be assumed for loss or breakage.
10. All material to be home grown.
11. AMATEURS ONLY PLEASE

POTTED PLANTS

All exhibits in this class must be potted at least two weeks before the fair.

Sections 1-13 prizes: 1st. \$2.00 2nd. \$1.50 3rd. \$1.00

1. Begonia - collection of 3, all different varieties, no more than 4" pots.
2. Specimen coleus, no more than 6" pot
3. Geranium, four or more blooms
4. Ivy or variegated leafed geranium
5. African violet, single crown in bloom
6. African violet collection, 3 different single crown plants in bloom
7. Fuchsia in bloom
8. Potted plant - other than foregoing, in bloom
9. Potted plant - other than foregoing, non-blooming
10. Terrarium, planted (not over 14" diameter)
11. Cacti garden, planted (not larger than 6" x 9")
12. Floral hanging pot or basket (not over 10"), in bloom, hanger to be considered
13. Foliage hanging pot or basket (not over 10"), hanger to be considered.

CUT FLOWERS

All flowers in this section should be displayed in suitable containers, bowls, baskets, vases, etc., and arranged for best decorative effect.
