All exhibits in this class must be potted at least two weeks before the fair.



- 6. Geranium, four or more blooms.
- 7. Ivy or variegated leafed geranium.

- 9. African violet collection, 3 different single crown plants in bloom

- 11. Potted plant other than foregoing, in bloom
