## P.M. should resign or call an election

Halton MP Otto Jelinek says either Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau should resign or dissolve Parliament and call a general election in the wake of the revelations in Macdonald Royal Commission report on RCMP wrongdoing which was brought down last week.

Last Wednesday Jelinek sent a telegram to Trudeau saying Canadians "were distressed to learn" the contents of the report which shows "that you, as Prime Minister, have been aware for over a decade of illegal activities taking place in Canada; the facts of which you ignored and hid from the Canadian people."

"As one Member of Parliament, I suggest that you either resign your position as Prime Minister or dissolve Parliament for the purpose of calling a general election, in order to give Canadians an opportunity to elect a Prime Minister who will conduct his activities in accordance with the oath of his office."

The Royal Commission found Trudeau and other high cabinet members during the 1970s were made aware that the RCMP Security Service did on occasion break the law but the Prime Minister and others failed to ask for specifics.

## Police still seeking witness or driver woman hit accident

Halton Regional Police are still seeking the driver or a witness to an accident in which an RR 2 Rockwood woman, Betty Hensworth was injured on August 14 at 12:10 p.m.

An appeal for the driver of the car or a witness to the accident at the corner of Church and Main Streets in this newspaper last week hasn't resulted in any information.

Inspector Matt McPherson said police "don't believe there was any driving offense involved" with the accident. Either the driver or a passenger got out of the car after the accident and asked the woman if she was hurt and she said no. It wasn't until two days later that she went to the hospital and discovered she had a broken wrist and foot.

McPherson said police are continuing their search for information so "the matter can be cleared up."

## Woman hurt seriously in two car crash

A Bramalea woman was seriously hurt in a two car crash on Sunday morning at the Alex Johnson Real Estate office at the corner of Mill and Main Streets.

Eileen Mabel Laing was sent to hospital as was the other driver, Jack Vandersleest of RRI, Georgetown, who suffered minor injuries, Halton Regional Police report.

The cars struck and damaged a traffic light standard and a large concrete flower pot. The building was also damaged by the impact.

Acton Firefighters were on the scene and forced a door on one of the vehicles open.

Police estimated damages to the Laing vehicle at \$7,000 and \$4,000 for the Vandersleest car.
