



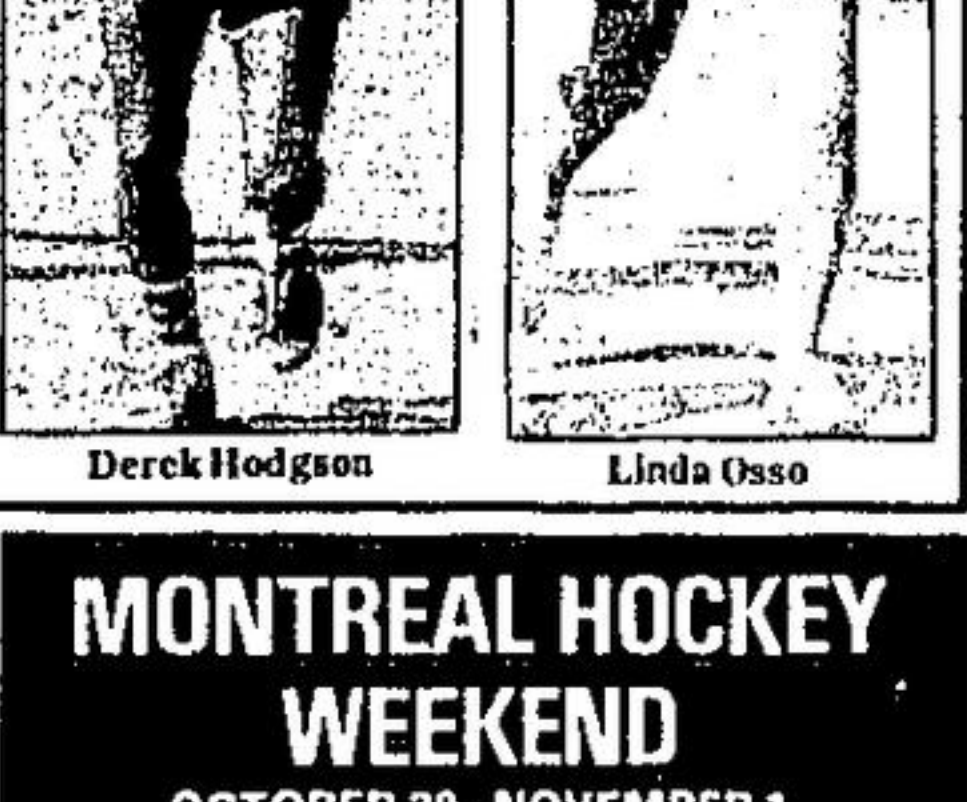
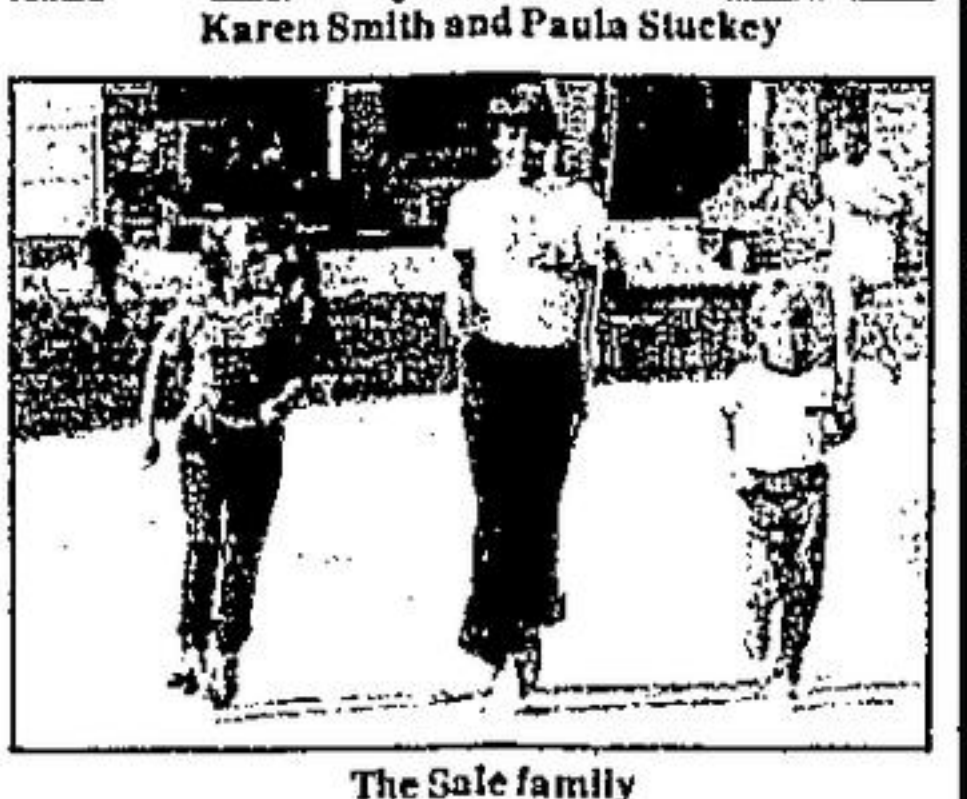
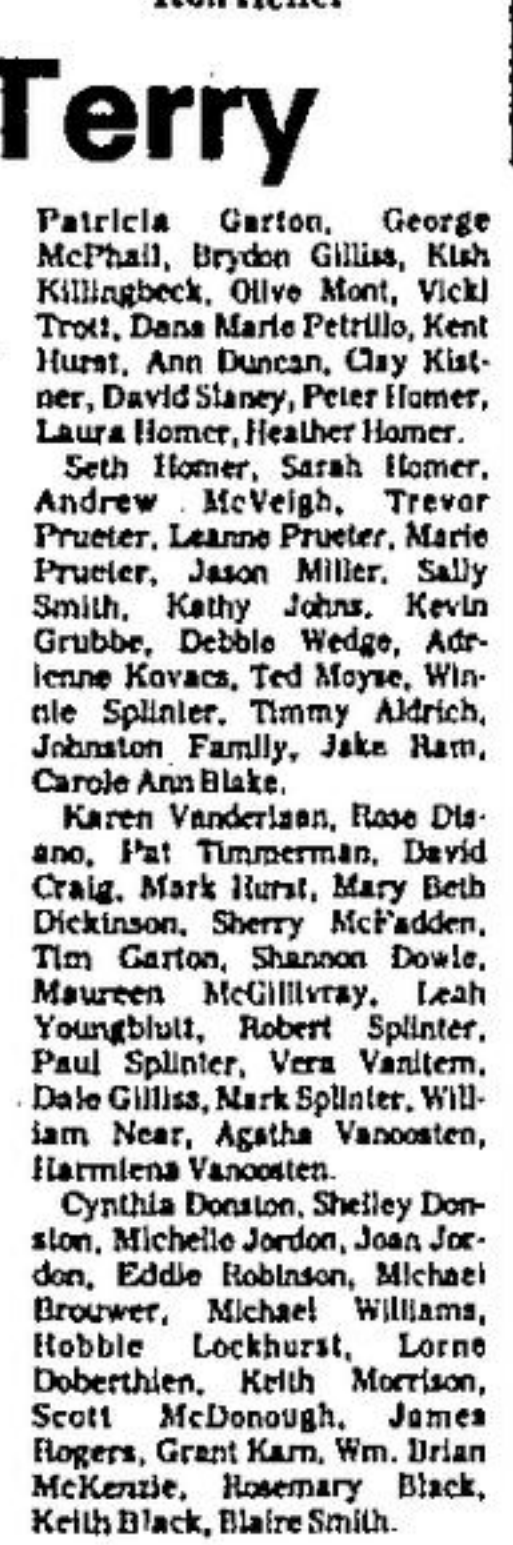

## CNIB drive is underway

A goal of \$4,000 has been set for the Acton area in the 1981 fund raising campaign for the Canadian National Institute for the Blind, this month.

Local campaign chairman Vic Bristow explained that all funds raised locally go to help the 10 local people who require assistance from the CNIB.

"I don't believe everyone realizes that CNIB relies on public contributions for the funds needed to continue these essential programs. It is only through our appeal once a year that CNIB is here to help when sight is lost," Bristow said.

CNIB's specialized programs provide blind people with the skills they need to take their place in community life—as wage earners, homemakers, students, parents—as fellow citizens, Bristow says. Talking books, counselling, and rehabilitation are just a few of the many services the blind can take advantage of thanks to fund raising drives such as Acton's.

"Remember," he added, "money can't buy sight but your dollars will help blind people help themselves through continuing CNIB services."
