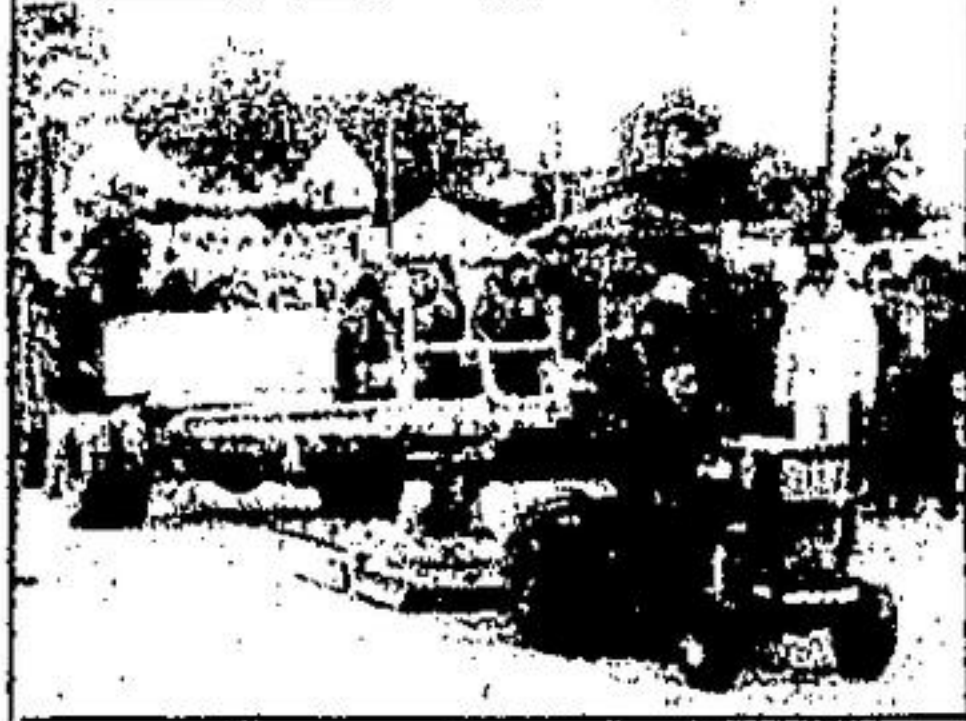
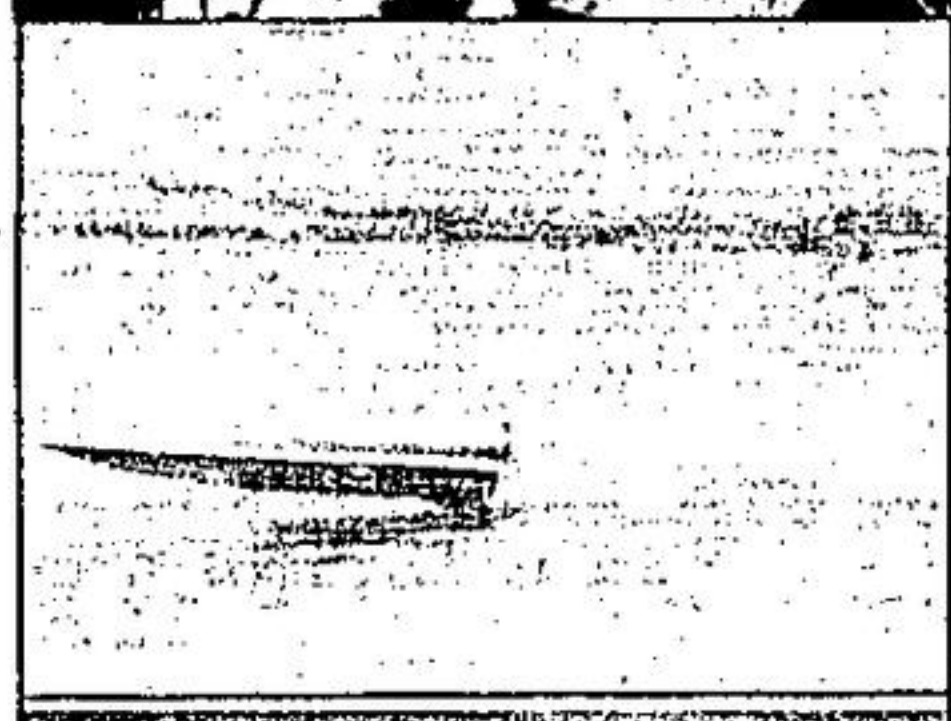

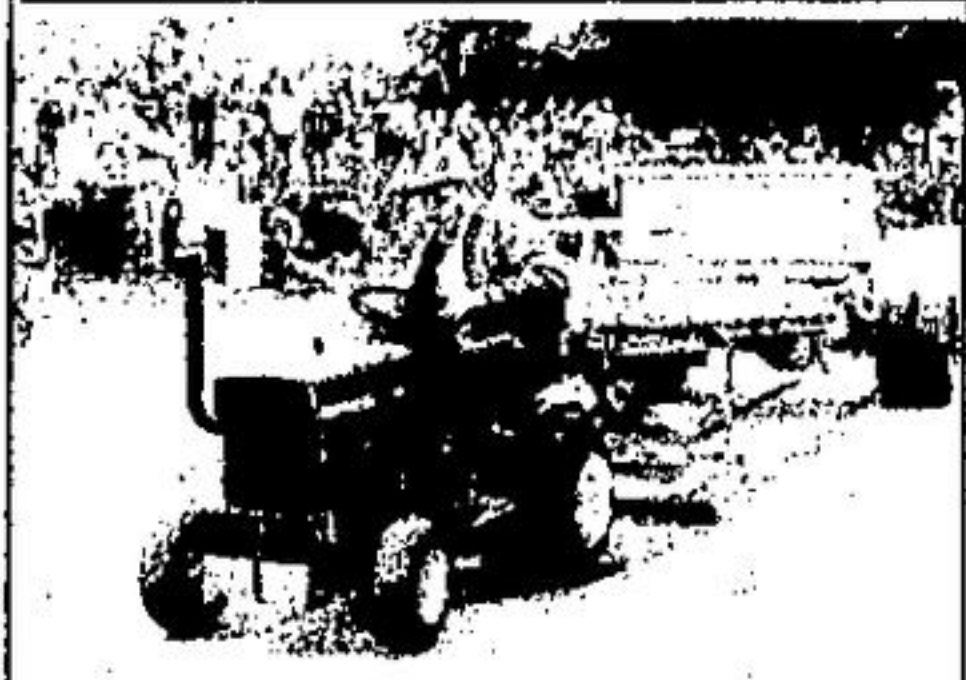
Gilles Naden of Acton has no trouble competing in the Pioneer Games log splitting contest.

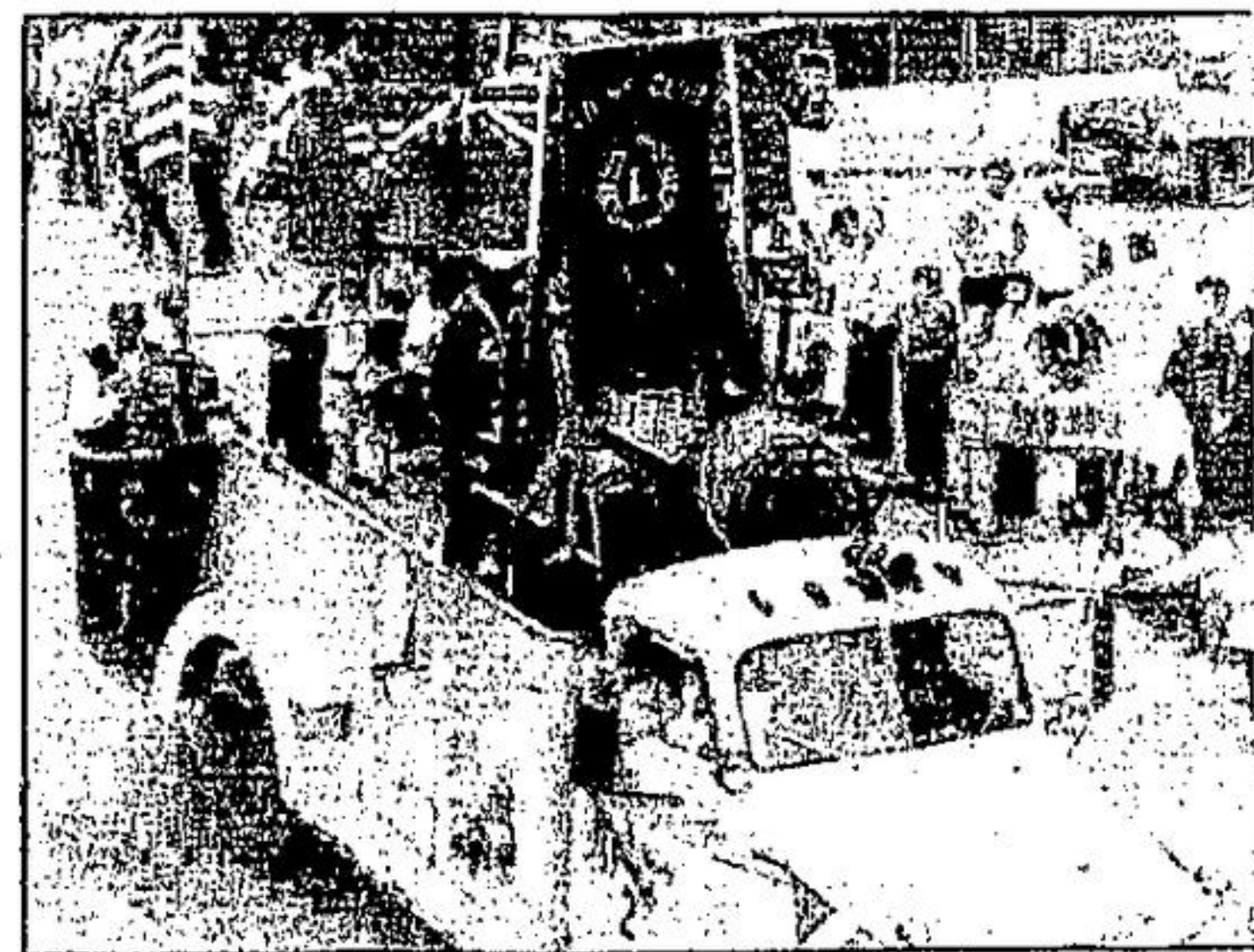
The sound of the model boats could be heard all over town on the weekend, even above the usual fair noise. Entries were up this year over last year.
