By trial and error

Last weekend over 50 off-road motorcycle enthusiasts converged near Sheridan College Heavy Equipment north of Milton. They weren't out to see who was the fastest, but which rider was the most skilled in a trials competition run by the Halton Off- Trevor Howard was close behind with just 48 points. You don't have to be the fastest to win at off-road like a bleycle rodeo for off-roaders. The riders have to drive around and over rocks, trees and creeks while accumulating the fewest penalty points.

In the end, experience proved to be the key to winning as Canadian champion Wayne Woloschuk gathered a mere 46 points to take the expert title.

Dave Thomas was best in the senior class with 68. next was Geoff Ditner with 104. G.A. Doroshenko was tops in the junior class with 83 points and Jamie Jones was second with 87.

Riders in trials competitions use regular off road bikes, with a few modifications. They can change the shocks and the gear ratios of the bikes to reduce speed and improve handling.

Even with the slow speed of the bikes, riders still found things difficult, said Brett Hayes. "It was a very tough event, we made it a little

tougher than we intended, but most of the riders were complimentary," he said. The few riders who did gripe to circuit designer

Hayes were the ones who suffered from the difficulty in the course. The Halton Off-Roaders club is one of the largest in the area. About two thirds of the membership

lives in the Acton-Georgetown area, with the remainder coming from Orangeville. The only other club close in size is one located in

The sport may not be growing dramatically, but it is becoming more accepted. Last weekend two representatives from the Regional Planning Department were on the scene to

A trials competition course is about six miles long, and isn't too exciting for spectators so a club can't make much money from attendance.






