**Acton can add 3,000 people**

There will be sewage capacity for 10,000 people in Acton, a letter to Halton Hills Planning Board from their planner Mario Venditti and regional planner Rash Mohammed predicts, based on a recently completed study.

The letter is an update on the Acton urban area review study which is an examination of limits to growth based on water and sewer service capacity.

The draft final report from consultants Proctor and Redfern isn't being released to the press, in fact many local councillors haven't seen it yet.

The contents of the study, which the letter indicates contains good news for Acton's ability to

grow, will be released at a public meeting at Acton High School at 7 p.m. on December 8.

The study recommends an urban area similar to what is already in the Halton Official Plan but with an addition of 148 acres of developable residential just east of Acton which would permit Acton's population to increase from around 7,000 people to about 10,000.

An additional 197 acres would be available for industrial development. Of those 197 acres, only 49 would have to be developed with just municipal water and septic tanks. The exact location of the 49 acres would be determined after further study.
