Delay protest of lot levies

For the second time this year Halton Hills councillors and members of a special Acton Chamber of Commerce committee didn't have to protest proposed region commercial-industrial lot levies.

Last week region staff was directed to go back and complete its study of the problem of bringing in industrial-commercial lot levies in north Halton before any approval of lot levy fees.

Earlier this year staff proposed \$2,400 an acre lot levies to finance servicing of undeveloped property. Council directed staff to study the matter and examine the impact on the north. Council also asked the province to front end the cost of water and sewer servicing of industrial-commercial property. At the time councillors and the chamber were going to protest that lot levies would hamper efforts to attract business here.

· Recently region staff asked council to pass interim levies until the study is completed.

Last week the staff's newest recommendation was tabled, preventing debate, and a move later to lift the matter from the table failed.

Councillor Dave Whiting says that now with the issue on hold the councillors and Chamber won't present their brief until the staff report comes back or the matter is raised again.


