Stop pits at 6p.m. — residents

The residents of the Fourth Line, on Lot 25, want any roadside pit in their area to stop operations at six at night, rather than the present 8 p.m.

Reconstruction of Highway 401 for approximately five miles west of Trafalgar has caused the Ministry of Transportation and Communications to list the Duenk, Cohoon and Boss properties all on the Fourth Line, as sources of gravel.

Wally Selihac, a Fourth Line resident, said he would like to see the hours cut to six at night.

Clerk Administrator Ken Richardson said the seven in the morning until eight at night are hours for all wayside pits in the Town. He said the pit operation means the actual hours the crusher is in operation, and noted the trucks must be loaded in time to be on Trafalgar Road no later than 6 p.m.

Selihac stated he really was opposed to any wayside pits, but urged council to compromise on the hours for the sake of the Fourth Line residents.

Councillor George Maltby said the present day situation is a compromise, and recalled a few years ago when the Town had no control, and the crushers ran until midnight or one in the morning.

He pointed out 300,000 tons could be taken out in six or seven days, so it was not a continuous operation.

Councillor Russ Miller explained the hours of operation at the other wayside pits had been arranged after consultation with the residents.

Al McFee said he realized the wayside pits cut costs for the MTC and all of Ontario taxpayers but emphasized it is at the expense of the people who live around them. He said the pits are a great inconvenience with dust, traffic, and noise, and contended an 11 hour a day operation is a long time for residents to endure. He said it was unacceptable to him.

Ted Lyons recalled council had talked about fixing up the Fourth Line up to Highway 7, and suggested there would be much more traffic on the road after that was completed.

"The investment of the people on that line is much more than the investment in a crusher." He noted the group is growing stronger and promised they would be back.

Mayor Pete Pomeroy warned the road repairs north of the pits would have to wait until the money can be found.

Councillor Pam Sheldon asked that the question of the Fourth Line reconstruction be taken to the budget committee, and asked that the wayside pit site plan be made available to the residents.

Councillor Marilyn Serjeantson suggested efforts be made to cut the hours of operation back to seven at night.

The mayor suggested that clause be held out, and further negotiations with the MTC be tried.

"The clerk administrator will use his best efforts to have the hours of operation changed to seven in the morning until seven at night," he added.
