Acton Legion cleared of food poisoning rumors

Rumors of food poisoning at the Acton Legion have proven to be unfounded. Word was circulating around town last week about suspected food poisoning of over 80 employees of Smith and Stone, Georgetown, after they had their Christmas party at the local Legion. Smith and Stone and Legion officials refused to comment on the matter, but Dr. Peter Cole of the Regional Health Office pointed out only one person was ill after the party and that was attributed to the current influenza bug taking its toll in town. "Additional absenteeism can most likely be attributed to after effects of the party and not food poisoning," the medical health officer said. He explained his office has done a complete investigation of the incident and has come up with no evidence of food poisoning.
