





## Appeal adjourned

The Crown's appeal of a careless driving sentence for a Burlington man in connection with a carbicycle accident in the summer of 1980 in which a former Acton and Esquesing resident was killed was adjourned Thursday until February 25.

Walter Valente was convicted of careless driving last summer and sentenced to a \$200 fine and his driver's licence suspended for a year.

Feeling the sentence was too soft for an incident in which three women were killed and two others injured, Crown Attorney James Treleaven ap-pealed. The case was to be heard Thursday, but because Valente has a new lawyer it was set over to February 25.

In the accident Lorraine Robertson (nee Lavigne) was killed. She had lived in the Acton area for eight years before moving with her husband and children to Hamilton.


