

BIA looks at store facelifts

Acton Business Improvement Area (BIA) has decided to have architectural drawings done showing a facelift of a block of downtown stores.

Leathertown chairman Chip Petriello informed the BIA board of management at a recent meeting that he had been approached by some architecture

students about doing designs of a facelift for downtown storefronts.

The BIA decided the students can redesign the fronts of stores on the north side of Mill St. East between Main St. North and Willow St. North. In addition the BIA set aside \$500 for this project.

Farnell retiring from hydro job

Graham Farnell is retiring from his position as manager of Halton Hills Hydro, after 21 years. However he will stay on as long as required while a replacement is learning the ropes.

Farnell served as an elected member of Georgetown Hydro Commission for 19 years before taking the full-time position of secretary treasurer and later manager with the Commission.

Hydro Commission Chairman Ab Tennant said the Commission is in the process of hiring a manager, and said from many applications, the number has been narrowed to three.

The final selection is expected to be made within the next two weeks.

Monday Halton Hills council made appointments to a number of boards and committees.

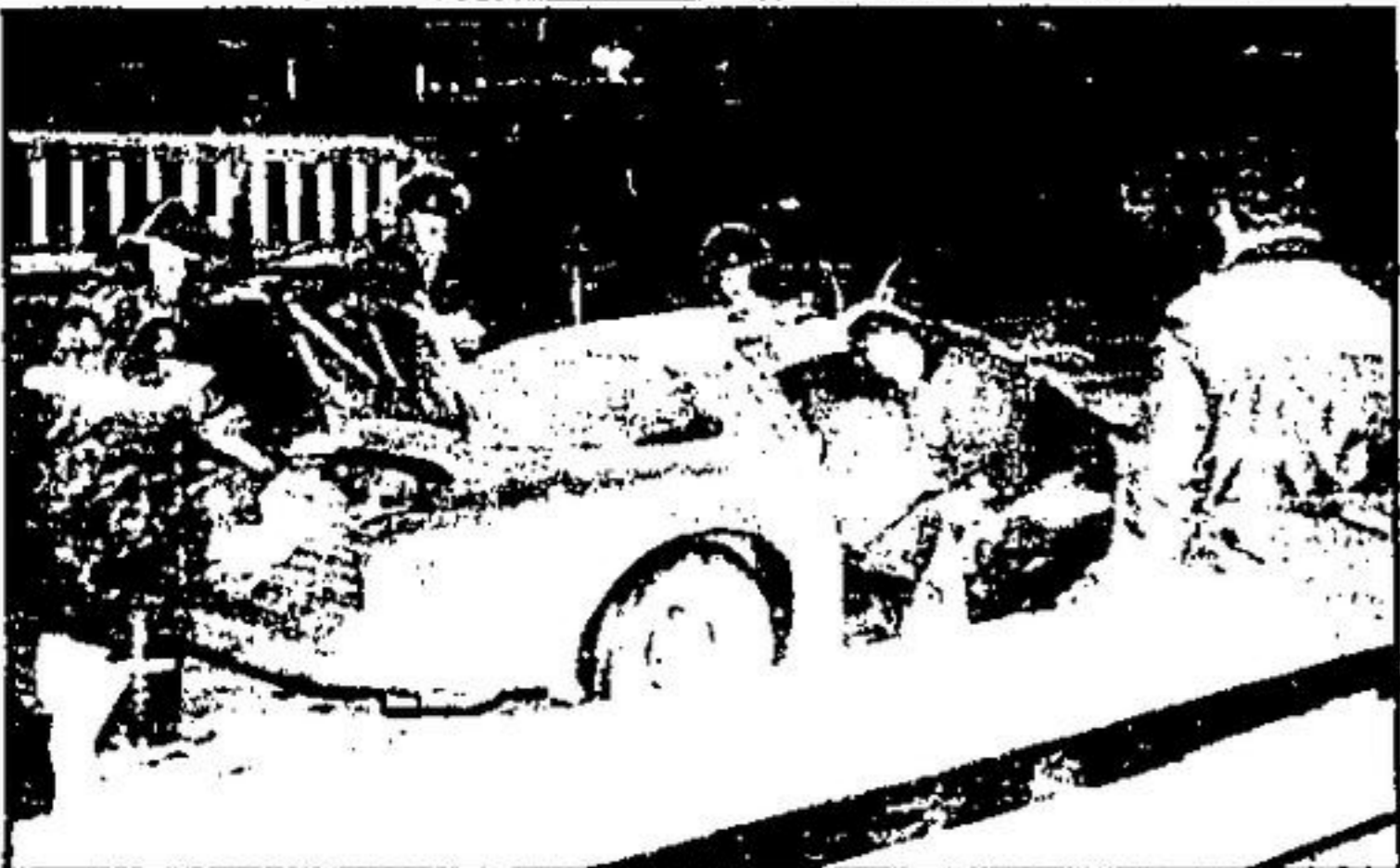

Sunday's fires were almost back to back. A chimney fire at 1:44 on the townline south of Highway 7 resulted in no damage. Then at 2:08 p.m. a car fire at lot 17, con. 3 resulted in \$2,000 in the vehicle according to deputy fire chief Bob Hyde.

Town to borrow up to \$5 million

Halton Hills is going to borrow as much as \$5 million to keep the municipality going.

Monday Halton Hills council passed its traditional resolution and bylaw authorizing the borrowing up to \$5 million to keep the municipality going until 1982 tax revenues start flowing to the coffers. Treasurer Ray King said he anticipates borrowing requirements will be considerably less than \$5 million but that amount would provide "maximum flexibility."
