Rev. Dr. John N. Buchanan and Rev. Dr. Forbes Thomson were the officiating ministers with Beth Barron as organist.



trance would be landscaped and a divider created to

produce two way traffic. A wheelchair ramp, chairs and tables for the hall, window frames and a fire alarm are slated for Acton Community Centre (the arena) at a cost of \$9,501 for the town and \$4,834 in subsidy.

Street lighting improvements around Acton are estimated at \$17,850. Gravel purchases in 1982 for road projects are

pegged at \$172,000.

Nine replacement trucks and garbage packers are expected to cost \$235,050, minus \$33,000 for trade-ins. New works department equipment, including a reversible snowplow will cost \$76,500 according to the capital budget.
