Cash, booze stolen

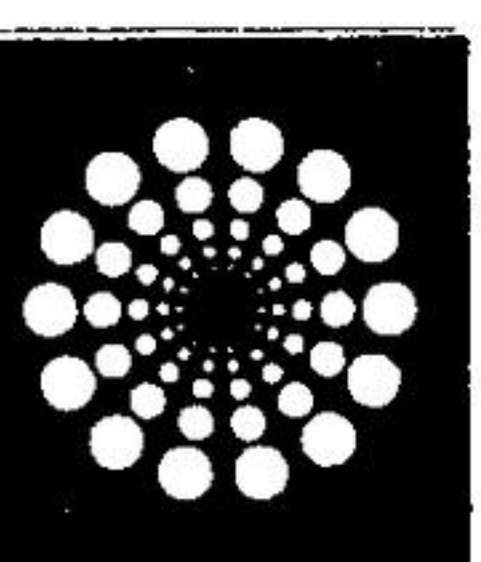

Approve site plan for new St. Joseph's

Halton Hills has approved the site plan for the new St. Joseph's School to be built on Mill St. West. A pupil pick-up and drop-off location must be approved by the town engineer and location and type of floodlighting must be okayed.

The separate school board must have the existing sidewalk curb in front of the site removed and replace it with a new 1.5 metre wide walk. The board must also have a new "concrete barrier type curb" built in front of the site. Another condition is engineering approval of all asphalt

patching and boulevard sodding in front of the school property. A transformer on the site plan must be relocated to conform to town regulations and the region must be satisfied with water and sewer service to the site and costs settled.
