Landlords must keep dwellings at 68 degrees

Landlords who include heat as part of the rent for a dwelling or living accommodations must keep the temperature at a minimum of 68 Fahrenheit. Monday general committee approved a draft bylaw which sets a minimum heat level for rental dwellings which will be enforced, upon complaint, by the Halton Medical Officer of Health's department. Clerk-administrator Ken Richardson told councillors this winter the town has received complaints about rented dwellings being cold. The draft bylaw for Halton Hills is modelled after bylaws used in other municipalities.

Councillors have nothing to do with "that bunch"

Halton Hills councillors want everyone to know they have nothing to do with "that bunch", better known as Halton Board of Education trustees. Councillor Harry Levy raised the issue of the board budget passed last week, which includes a 20 per cent increase in local taxes, at council Monday night. He said he wants everyone to understand the board isn't under town control; council isn't responsible for the board's spending. Councillor Dave Whiting noted the board's director of education Wally Beevor will be at Acton's council drop-in on April 2 and urged other councillors attend to ask the top board administrator questions. He said he'll be asking Beevor how the board got so "carried away" with this year's budget, and he'll be looking for a better answer than most of the spending is on teacher and staff wages.

Chamber after speakers

Acton Chamber of Commerce is going after some heavyweight speakers for luncheons this year. President Dave Whiting said this week recently elected provincial Liberal leader Dave Peterson's office has indicated Halton-Burlington MPP Julian Reed's boss will be coming here for a speaker's luncheon in June. A definite date has not yet been set. Another new leader, Bob Rae, could also be coming here. The office of the New Democrats' chief has expressed strong interest in his visiting here. "He's definitely willing to come, but they can't set a date yet." Premier William Davis is booked up into the summer, however his office indicated to the Chamber a speaker's luncheon visit could be arranged for this fall. Davis is also available for the Citizen of the Year banquet this spring. Federal Tory leader Joe Clark's staff will be sitting down soon to plan his schedule for the next few months and Acton is on the list of possible stops. There have been calls to Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau's office, but no indication yet if he is interested in coming here. NDP leader Ed Broadbent's office expressed a desire to have their man come to Acton in the event he is in the Halton area this year and there is time for a visit here. There has been no answer from cabinet star Jean Chretien's office.
