Extend plan approval

Halton Hills has agreed to extending draft plan approval for the North Halton Real Estate development planned for Main St. North adjacent to the industrial area.

Last year the town and region approved the 25 semi-detached homes and 30 townhouse development.

The developer has been having engineering work completed, but is having some problems satisfying Ministry of Environment concerns. Efforts to resolve the problems may not be completed before the draft plan approval expires.

General committee agreed to the one year extension of the draft plan approval, however the subdivision agreement approved last year will be reviewed later to make sure the municipality doesn't want to change any of the terms and conditions.
