# His lawyer tells jury Lots of "reasonable doubt" surrounding Mike McCristall

"Reasonable doubt means never having to say, 'I wonder...'"  
As he drew to an end of his address to the jury, John D. Smith, defense counsel for Michael McCristall equated his feelings on the second degree murder trial with the infamous saying from the movie *Love Story*—"Love means never having to say you're sorry."  
Smith told the jury there were nine points of reasonable doubt in the case against his client. The August 19 decision to remove the rubble of the north-east end of the building before a thorough investigation was conducted could have denied evidence to exonerate his client. No one look the gas furnace or fittings apart to

determine if natural gas was a possible cause of the fire, he noted. A gas company employee merely looked through a hole.  
The theory of where the fire started is Smith's reasonable doubt two. If, as the Crown contends, the fire started in Cripps' room at the hand of McCristall, why would he start the fire in that room, where it was known he was located? And why, Smith asks, would he not wait until later in the night?

Another person on the scene who has never been charged should be a suspect in the case, contended the defense counsel. Counsel does not have to show this person, who testified, started the fire, Smith said, although he had a certain amount of motive in that his male vanity was hurt and he got mad at Mercuri. Smith pointed out the testimony of this person's actions around the time of the fire differed from the testimony of two rest home employees. No one ever considered him as a suspect, Smith said.

Self-confessed arsonist Cecil Kirby is a long way "from poor old Mike McCristall" contends the defense lawyer. Smith pointed out how Kirby almost lost control of his emotions when shaking hands with Mercuri's lawyer. "It was one of the most frightening things I have seen in a court room," he said.  
Kirby's life is in constant danger, Smith said. "I ask you not to waste any tears for Kirby, he never wasted any tears for the man he killed in Toronto."  
Reasonable doubt five, Smith contended, is that McCristall had no motive to burn the hotel. In two-and-a-half years investigation, no one has been able to provide any motive for McCristall burning his home, the bane of his existence, the centre of his universe.

The air conditioner McCristall was seen touching offers no indication it had anything to do with the fire. The air conditioner acted as a conduit carrying smoke from the inside of the building. The black smoke, Smith said, was probably the burning of the knobs inside the building.  
"Are you going to convict a man because he felt an air conditioner?"  
McCristall was a hero, a significant person following the fire, Smith told the jury. Reasonable doubt seven in Smith's mind was the snippets of conversation heard August 23 by Kim Allan in the Station Hotel. Allan testified she heard the accused instructing Bert Eade to tell the fire marshal's office that he woke people up the night of the fire. As for the cover up statement, maybe McCristall believed the gossip around town about Mercuri and the fire.

"Do you not think if he was guilty he would have a nice quick explanation instead of a mixed-up account? (of the fire)? Smith asked the jury. Why would Mercuri use McCristall as a torch man?  
"Just for the sake of argument, let's assume Mercuri was going to burn down the hotel... and that he tried to hire Cecil Kirby," Smith said. Does it always have to cost \$10,000 (Kirby's asking price). Couldn't he have found someone cheaper? The lawyer questioned.  
McCristall helped awaken people, called the owner, and stayed around during the fire. These were not the actions of a guilty man, Smith noted.

His client was not a letter perfect witness, he pointed out. "You saw how he acted, did he seem like a man who would commit murder?" the lawyer asked.  
After 49 years of living, as a good character, McCristall should be able to draw upon his good past, Smith said.  
His October 1979 arrest is Smith's reasonable doubt number nine. October 11-23 McCristall was arrested for the murder. The Crown Attorney's office recommended release pending further evidence. However, no more evidence was found between then and the second December 28 arrest.

Beavor countered the board has closed some schools and will be looking at closing more and then selling them. However, he warned it is hard to close a school because of community outrage. Miller noted all north trustees were elected by acclamation so he wondered how it could be said schools can't be closed because it's a politically explosive move.  
Whiting said the board should follow the region's suggestion of having developers pay to build new schools the same as they front-end water and sewer costs. Beavor said the board can't do that under the Education Act, but Whiting countered the region could do the job for the board through subdivision agreements. If municipalities want to help the board they should give the school system its money as soon as it collects the taxes, Beavor said. Whiting and Beavor agreed both ideas should be examined.

Bruce said busing more and not building new schools is something trustees have to start looking at. "I know we have to get tough and should have earlier on school closings."  
Knechtel said he wasn't sure the education hierarchy appreciated the depth of Cook's concerns and the feelings about education taxes which was expressed in two recent editorials in the Free Press. He noted since the town sends out the tax bills councillors hear from ratepayers. "What Bill said you could go and hear from the 7,000 people here," Knechtel said it is "absolutely essential" that the board communicate better with the public and explain their spending better. He also said board spending and education taxes are forcing council to cut back on its own spending and charge for things like sports field rentals.

Beavor said he has visited two Acton schools and found there are "substantial" facilities, opportunities for students, and highly qualified staff.
