Calcium on gravel roads by the end of May

Calcium will be put on rural roads to cut down on dust by the end of this month.

Allowing conditions are dry these days. Councillor Russ Miller told Halton Hills council Monday night that rural residents are complaining about dust and asked when something will be done.

Engineer Robert Austin answered that calcium isn't usually put on gravel roads until June, although it was done early last year and likely will be done by the end of the month, probably earlier, adding it can't be done yet because the frost is barely out of the ground on some roads now being graded.

The reasons for the proposed removal of the designation are as follows:

- Building condemned by Ontario Ministry of Labour - Industrial Health and Safety Branch dated 1978 03 13 in its present condition.
- Studies have indicated substantial cost to restore the said building.
- To facilitate the demolishing of the existing building and prepare the site for parking spaces.

Any person may, within thirty (30) days after the date of this notice send by mail or deliver to the Clerk Administrator of the Corporation of the Town of Halton Hills notice of their objection to this action and Council will consider all submissions prior to final enactment of the repealing By-law.

The last date for filing objections will be the 28th day of May, 1982.

Ontario Tax Grants For Senior Citizens

1982 Instalments of up to \$310 Have Been Mailed

Ontario Tax Grants for Seniors is a program designed specifically to help offset municipal and school taxes for Ontario residents 65 and over. The Ontario Ministry of Revenue has just completed the mailing of cheques which comprise the first instalment of the 1982 Property Tax Grant of up to \$250 and a new temporary Home Heating Grant of \$60. These cheques were mailed on May 10th.

Who received it?

- If you're 65 or over and own or rent your home, you're eligible for the Property Tax Grant.
- The 1982 instalment cheque was mailed to all Ontario seniors who received the 1981 Property Tax Grant.
- This is intended to help you pay your property tax or rent for the first part of 1982. In the fall you will automatically receive an application for the balance of your grant.

Who did not receive it?

Basically, if you didn't receive a 1981 Property Tax Grant, you will not have received the May instalment. In particular, seniors should note that:

- If you reside in a nursing home, home for the aged or any property tax-exempt institution, you're not eligible for the Property Tax Grant.
- If you turned 65 after December 31, 1981 (and therefore did not qualify for a grant last year) you also won't have received the May instalment. However, you will receive an application for the entire 1982 grant in the fall.

Temporary Home Heating Grant

This year a temporary Home Heating Grant of \$60 has been added to the Tax Grants Program to help seniors cope with the sudden increases in heating costs. This \$60 is included in your 1982 instalment cheque. For example, if you received a Property Tax Grant of \$480 for 1981, your 1982 instalment amounts to \$300 (1/2 of \$480 = \$240 plus \$60).
