1. **Grant** - If you have less than 5% equity in your home you may be eligible for a grant up to \$3,000 for one year.
2. **Interest Deferral** - If you have more than 5% equity in your home, your lender may be able to defer your interest payments by up to \$3,000 for one year. This deferred interest may be guaranteed by CMHC.

Irene Cole sentenced to 18 months in jail

An Acton woman has been sentenced to 18 months in jail after pleading guilty to criminal negligence causing death. Dorothy Irene Cole, of Cameron St. had originally been charged with second degree murder in the August 18, 1981 death of three-year-old Paul Steven Johnston. Inglewood when the car in which he was riding was struck head on by the Cole vehicle on Highway 10, just north of Orangeville. Paul's father, Stanley Joseph Johnston, was hospitalized for a month with head injuries. Mr. Chief Justice J.T.

Evans in Orangeville Supreme Court, also sentenced Mrs. Cole to three years probation after she gets out of jail, and suspended her driver's license for five years. She must also stay away from alcohol for two years. She received a concurrent three month sentence for criminal negligence causing bodily harm. The court heard last Tuesday how Mrs. Cole, travelling south-bound on Highway 10 entered the middle of three lanes and accelerated to about 130 kilometers an hour. She hit the Johnston vehicle head on as it was legally passing, also in the middle lane. The boy died of head injuries in the Hospital for Sick Children, Toronto. His mother Elizabeth Johnston was driving. Mrs. Cole was sent to Metro West Detention Centre for assessment to determine where she will serve her sentence.
