Bruce says it took hom four-and-a-half-hours to complete the race compared to the winner's time of two hours, 20 minutes. Bruce said he chose Ottawa because it was a scenic route leaving Carlton University, down along the Rideau Canal to downtown, passing the Parliament Buildings along the Ottawa River and back to Carlton.


He stated, in running the race it was after a mile or a mile-and-a-half before there was room to move as 3,000 runners started the race.
