Provincial budget could cause school board deficit

The May 13 provincial budget has put the Halton Board of Education in danger of a \$356,000 deficit.

In that budget, according to trustee Bill Priestner, is the imposition of sales tax on many purchases by school boards which have previously been exempt.

"Our board has estimated the effect of this change to be \$356,000 for the remainder of the 1982 fiscal year," which was not covered in Halton's budget in March, he pointed out in a letter to Minister of Education Dr. Bette Stephenson.

"In accordance with Ministry requirements, our 1982 budget was established and approved by the board in March of 1982," the letter continued. "The local Mill rates required to produce a balanced budget have also been set by our municipalities. The net result is that our board is now faced with a built-in deficit for 1982, of \$356,000 and no access to offsetting revenues."

As a result, the board has asked the ministry to review the 1982 per pupil amounts, giving more grants to assist in the financing of the sales tax.

The decision to send the letter to Stephenson was passed without comment at Thursday evening's board meeting in Burlington.

Sept. 15 trial on drug charge

Glen Jocque, of Acton, will stand trial September 15 on one count of trafficking in cannabis resin.

Jocque appeared Monday in Milton Provincial Court to set a date for trial.

He was arrested in February after a region-wide drug sweep by RCMP and Halton Regional Police.

Two other Acton men, Samuel Herbert Mills and Stephen McGiloway will also stand trial in September. A fourth man charged, David Dunn, is tried tomorrow (Thursday).

GO fares up

Go Transit trips will cost passengers an average of 16 per cent more beginning July 1.

Acton travellers to Union Station will see an increase of 80 cents to \$4.40 one way. Riders to Yorkdale will be paying \$4.30, up 70 cents from \$3.80. The trip from Acton to Guelph will go up 20 cents, from \$1.50 to \$1.70.

The increase is necessary, according to GO officials, to offset fuel and labor costs in running GO's bus and rail operation and the higher rental charges imposed by CN Rail for railway lands used for GO station and parking facilities.

"While GO continues to seek other revenue sources to keep fares equitable by leasing its bus and rail equipment on weekends and by selling prime advertising space on the system, a Provincial directive requires GO to recover 65 per cent of its operating costs through the farebox," a press release states.

It continues, "The remainder is subsidized by the Government of Ontario to make fares more affordable for passengers than they would otherwise be. The new fares will result in passengers paying five cents more plus seven-tenths of a cent per kilometre per trip."

Board requests a grant review

Thursday evening, board trustees voted to petition the ministry to review the impact the equalization factors have had on the calculation of their 1982 General Legislature Grants.

Copies of the resolution will be sent to the four municipal councils in Halton for their consideration and support.
