**Falkland war isn't over — Eva**

The war over the Falkland Island may be over, but the hostilities are still there, according to Eva Sansom, RR4 Acton, who was born and raised in Argentina.

She and British-raised husband Geoff, now a teacher at Acton High School, used to joke about the ownership of the Islands. Both had been brought up being told their country owned the land.

However, when fighting broke out over just that question, it ceased being a joking matter.

Eva doesn't feel anything has been settled. Now, three months and hundreds of lives later, the two countries are right back where they started. Peace may only be temporary, she warns.

But, it is the two countries' governments which are at war, not the people, she pointed out. Eva thinks now the Argentina people are more hostile towards their own government than they ever were with Britain, which was confirmed in a letter received by another Acton resident Ana-Marie Cosimo.

Mrs. Cosimo was born and raised in Argentina and still has many relatives living in her home country. A recent letter she received from her aunt, still in Argentina, revealed the people's anger at being misled by the government.

She explains that Argentinians were asked to contribute money and jewellery towards the war effort to raise funds. However, they were led to believe Britain would not fight, and the Argentinians could win the islands back with no problem. All through the undeclared war her native people were being told they could win.

**Late teacher honored with memorial plaque**

An Acton High School student, Paul McTrash, has presented the school with a handmade plaque in memory of a late teacher Patricia Kastner Wright.

Mrs. Wright died last June at the age of 33. She was a remedial English teacher, later turning to Special Education. She was married the August before her death.

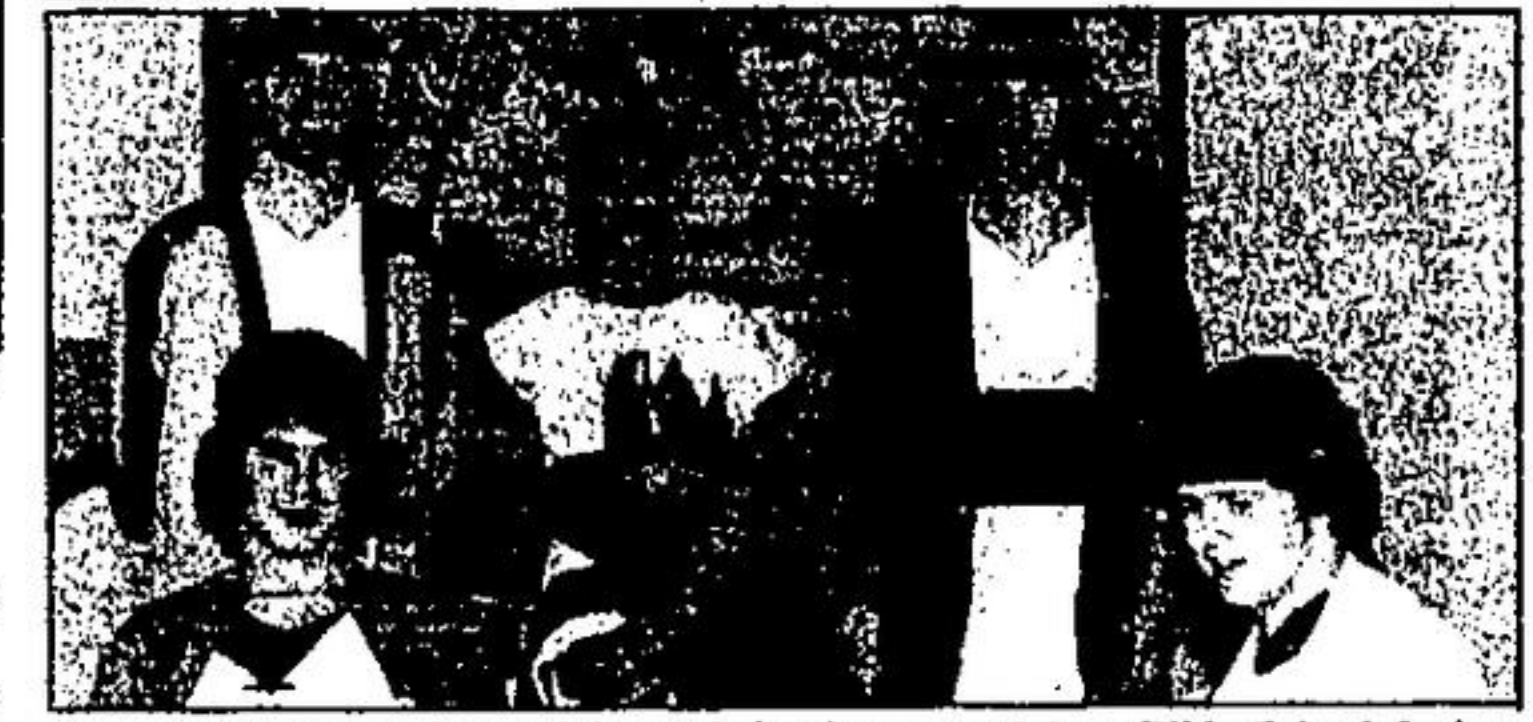
Paul made the mounting for the plaque out of walnut, and spent about one month on the project. On the gold plate read "In Loving Memory of Patricia Kastner Wright, February 19, 1948 to June 7, 1981, Teacher and Friend."

At the time of her death, and again last Friday a collection was taken at the school for the Cancer Society.

The dedication service was given over the public address system Friday.

Donations will also be accepted in the main office today and tomorrow and will be forwarded to the Cancer Society in her honor.
