**Halton board asks for increased grants**

The extra money the Ontario government rakes in as a result of its new sales tax on school supplies may be partially redistributed in Halton through increased per pupil grants.

At least, that's what the board of education has in mind. At last Thursday night's meeting, school board trustees voted to ask education minister Bette Stephenson to raise per pupil grants to help offset the extra \$356,000 the Halton school board will have to pay in sales tax due to the May 13 provincial budget.

"We are quite sure the minister was not aware of the problem when setting up the grant structure earlier this year," said finance committee chairman Bill Priestner.

The board is not asking for all the money to cover the \$356,000. It is requesting the minister increase the grant ceilings to allow the ministry to pay 45 per cent of the total which is the percentage of the board's total budget paid by the province.

**Blood clinic is successful**

In what was considered a "very successful" blood donor clinic last Tuesday, over 160 donors volunteered to give blood, with a total of 152 actual pints taken.

The Acton Unit of the Red Cross Society was pleased with the turnout.
