It is easy to understand why every little girl dreams of owning her own real-life pony after watching the faces of the audience as the darling circus ponies danced into their hearts. The two palominoes, the tiny Welsh pony, and a bay mare—who bore an uncanny resemblance to Lori

Harnden, Jennifer Douglas, Andrea Seads and Jeanette Jollimore—performed with equestrian perfection on the balance beams and in the circus ring.

Two daredevil monkeys livened up the audience

Two daredevil monkeys livened up the audience with scary feat's on fast-moving hot rods. The antics of the mischevious pair, Bruce Rodgers and Greg Johnson, drew a loud applause. The applause had barely stopped though when the Ringmaster displayed daring courage by taming a ferocious, paw-swinging lion and growling leopard up to a stool and then through a burning hoop of fire. The menacing lion, Almee Kamminga; and leopard, Chris Peters, filled the air with the silence of fright and the Ringmaster's bravery left the audience in awe.

Trampoline artists Lisa Ball, Lesley Fairles and Greg Johnson, displayed agility and excellent timing while performing tricks with a ball and skipping rope on the high trampoline. Hand flips were performed with superb grace and polse by four acrobats Michelle Neath, Andrea Seeds, Lori Harnden and Leah Witherly, and two beautiful trapeze artists, Beckie Boycott and Jennifer Douglas, executed death-defying swings and turns on the high wires. They were accompanied by their partners Chris Peters and Justin Elder.

Every circus has an unforgettable act and in this case the two lumbering elephants stole the show. Billed as "Big Nose" and "Big Ears", elephants Elliott Glass and Lesley Fairles stood on one leg on a high stool, rolled over, and just generously lumbered their way into everyone's heart.

This is the third time the Blg Top has come to Speyside and each time it has proven to be a show that delights both the young and the young-at-heart. Circus producer Mary Skier (who occasionally moonlights as Speyside Public School's kindergarten teacher) and Assistant Director Pat Mitchell (known to some as a parent volunteer) are obviously circus lovers and together with their very professional cast of performers put on a show that is difficult to beat.
