Send lawyer hall hearing

There will be a Conservation Review Board hearing on Acton Town Hall, probably in Acton.

Halton Hills council, this week voted to send legal counsel and staff to the hearing on the removal of the Heritage designation, from the building.

Councillor Mike Armstrong opposed the holding of the hearing contending council has already made the decision to demolish the building. He argued it would be an unnecessary expense and a "rehash of the past four years."

Councillor Ross Knechtel maintained many people in Acton had spent time and money trying to preserve the hall, and should have the opportunity to oppose the removal of the heritage designation.

Mayor Pete Pomeroy pointed out the hearing is mandatory, once a building is so designated. "I admit it will cost a few bucks," he added.

Councillor Roy Booth and Mike Armstrong both pointed out the resolution recommended at committee the previous week should not be endorsed since it was unnecessary if a hearing had to be held anyway.

Councillor Pam Sheldon said a hearing was simply a matter of good faith since council had advertised for comments from the public.

Councillor George Malby termed having a hearing, "only a matter of fair play."

No date for the hearing has been set.

An Acton man has been sentenced to four months in jail and is losing his driver's license for three years.

John Walter Barlow, Church St., was found guilty last month of criminal negligence in connection with a high speed police chase and theft of a vehicle.

For his criminal negligence conviction, he was given four months in jail, one year's probation, three months mandatory license suspension and 33 months extended suspension. He received a four month jail term, running concurrent, for the theft charges.

Public meeting for new real estate office


Halton Hills general committee approved a public meeting to be held so people can comment on a rezoning for a house at 25 Main St. North so a real estate office can be located on the bottom floor.

D and D Nikic applied recently for the rezoning. A staff report says the 7,594 square foot site contains a two storey house. The land is designated for commercial in the Official Plan and the property is zoned commercial holding. Once the holding is lifted a number of commercial uses, including a business office, would be permitted.

The first floor, once the building is converted, will be a real estate office with an apartment on the second floor. There will also be an eight car parking lot in the rear.

A date for the public meeting so citizens can comment on the rezoning will be announced later.

Five men charged in connection with the theft of about \$15,000 worth of hides from Beardmore between September and December of last year were again remanded for a set a date appearance.

Mark Gourlay, John Jordan, Allan Doley and David Hall all appeared in Milton Provincial Court Monday for a set a date, but the case was adjourned to July 26 because one of the defendants hasn't completed his legal aid application. All four are charged with theft over \$200 and conspiracy. A fifth man, Nick Marinos, is charged only with conspiracy.

Police alleged former employees at Beardmore and Tyler Transport were stealing the hides, taking them to Toronto and selling them to a shoe repair shop.

A preliminary hearing is expected to be held for the case this fall.
