



Award the Glenlea reconstruction contract

The phase one reconstruction work project for Glenlea subdivision was awarded Monday night to a Mississauga firm by Halton Hills general committee. The bid of \$194,610 from G. Macera Construction was the lowest of five the town received. The region will pay \$15,900 of the cost since sewer and water work is included in the project. In addition the committee approved Philips Planning and Engineering to supervise the construction work. That firm did the design work.

Legal Aid to pay for trial transcript

Two men serving prison terms for the August 19, 1979 death of Howard Gibbons will be receiving legal aid to appeal their cases.

Cosimo Mercuri, found guilty of second degree murder in April following a lengthy trial is currently serving a life sentence in the Hamilton-Wentworth Detention Centre. He will remain there until after his appeal.

Michael McCristall, found guilty of manslaughter by the same jury, is out on bail pending his appeal.

Gibbons died in a fire which levelled the Dominion Hotel in 1979. The Crown contended Mercuri deliberately set the fire to collect the insurance benefits, and McCristall helped.

Upon their conviction April 8, both men filed prisoners' notices of appeal. Application had to be made to Legal Aid however, to see who would be paying for the transcript of the trial, which can be quite costly.

Legal Aid has agreed to pay for the transcript and the lawyers' fees, according to Michael Moldaver, Mercuri's defense lawyer.

Both Moldaver and Jane Arnp, of Greenspan Arnp, McCristall's lawyer, are looking towards an early 1983 appeal date. Ms. Arnp pointed out the transcript should be received by October, at the earliest and it is usually a couple of months after that the appeal is set. This depends on both solicitors' schedules.

Town seeks labor costs

Some provincial funds have been allocated to Halton Hills by the province to hire people to carry out public works projects and create employment.

The province allocated \$20,375 to cover labor costs for projects and invited Halton Hills to apply by June 30 (today).

Monday general committee approved applying for the Ontario Employment Incentive Program funds and the municipality is also asking for an extra \$3,721.

Staff outlined five make work projects which could be carried out, including two in Acton. Labor cost would be \$9,000 for structural repairs to the Acton arena and the total cost of the work would be \$15,000. Another \$5,000, \$4,536 of which would be for labor costs, would be spent on cleanup of School Creek between McDonald Blvd. and Fairy Lake. The other three projects are in Georgetown. In total the town wants \$30,096 from the province for wages for the five projects costing a total of \$43,500.

Some students find jobs, many more still looking

The Canada Employment Centre for Students has had some success in placing students in jobs, but there are lots more still seeking jobs.

The Student Manpower office runs in Acton every Wednesday morning from 9 a.m. to noon at the Acton Social Services and Information Centre, 113 Mill St. East.

So far about 100 Acton students have registered for work and 10 have been placed in full-time summer jobs while temporary positions have been found for 10 others.

Manpower staff note Acton students are eager to tackle any type of job, including lawn cutting and gardening, painting, general cleanup work and babysitting, etc. Employers seeking summer help or homeowners needing someone to do odd jobs are encouraged to call 853-3310 on Wednesday mornings or 877-7417, the Georgetown office, at other times.

Students who haven't already registered are encouraged to go the Acton office Wednesday mornings and register.
