

Some provincial funds have been allocated to Halton Hills by the province to hire people to carry out public works projects and create employment.

The province allocated \$26,375 to cover labor costs for projects and invited Halton Hills to apply by June 30

(today). Monday general committee approved applying for the Ontario Employment Incentive Program funds and the municipality is also asking for an extra \$3,721.

Staff outlined five make work projects which could be carried out, including two in Acton. Labor cost would be \$9,000 for structural repairs to the Acton arena and the total cost of the work would be \$15,000. Another \$5,000, \$4,536 of which would be for labor costs, would be spent on cleanup of School Creek between McDonald Blvd. and Fairy Lake. The other three projects are in Georgetown. In total the town wants \$30,096 from the province for wages for the five projects costing a total of \$43,500.


