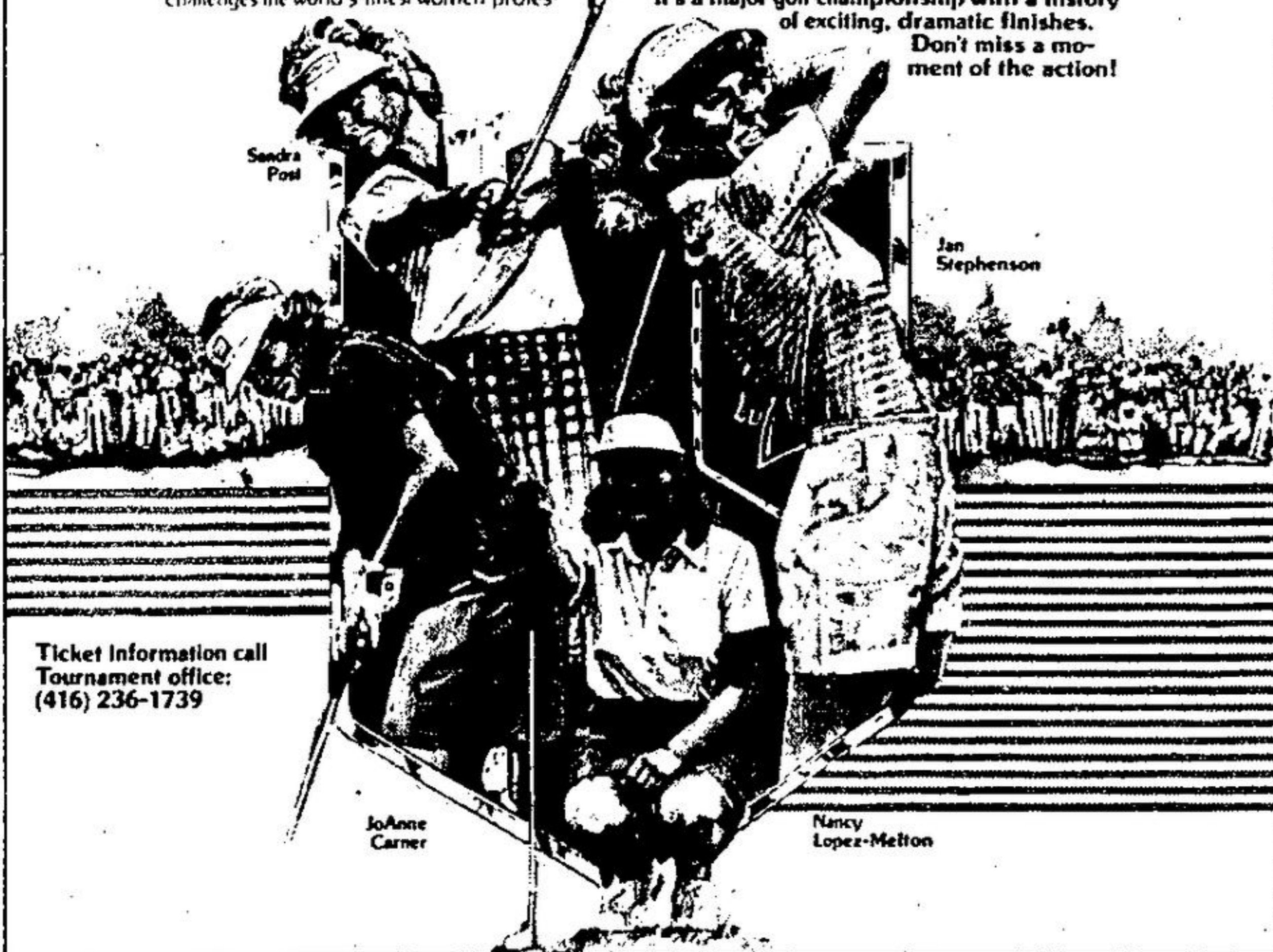

Validate land title

Halton Hills council has passed a bylaw to validate the title for 54 Cobblehill Rd. owned by Robert and Ann Barrow.
Back in 1962 Acton acquired 78 feet of land in the area to expand the cemetery. The remainder of the lot taken over by the municipality was conveyed to adjacent lots. However,

industries in the area the streets are heavily travelled at peak time. Left turns to and from Agnes were described as "hazardous" and some driveways in the area are hidden.
