# Bikes hazard on roads — safety officer

Halton Police Constable Rod Beaumont will be on patrol this summer looking for bicycle traffic violations.

Constable Beaumont, Halton's newest safety officer, claims bicycles are the number one safety hazard with children. "About half the kids you see riding bicycles on the street aren't using the handlebars. They're very proficient on their bicycles. They can balance and steer around corners with no hands," he observed.

Adults on bicycles haven't the same skill, but they aren't much better at obeying the rules of the road, he added. "People don't realize that they can get a ticket on a bicycle the same way they can in a car," Beaumont said. "And the fines are almost as stiff."

Bicyclists can be fined \$13 for running a traffic signal, can be charged with careless driving and can even lose points, same as drivers, he said. "Regular police patrols don't have the time to watch for traffic violations by bicyclists, but I do."

As Halton Police Safety Officer, Beaumont will be covering Georgetown, Acton and Milton, visiting schools and running bicycle safety and traffic safety programs for children.

Beaumont has been with the force nearly six years on regular uniform patrol. As safety officer he will be working mainly with children, something he enjoys doing,

but also with school crossing guards, Halton Social Services, Block Parents, and Halton District Safety Council. A regular officer is more effective as a

safety officer than a civilian, Beaumont feels. "The children in schools have a certain respect for a police officer. The uniform still holds them in awe."

However, since he wants to get to kids more on a one-to-one basis, Beaumont plans to get involved in school phys ed programs and other activities. And since he has all summer to make plans for his programs, he also hopes to visit children's day camp programs to talk on bicycle and pedestrian safety. The police safety program includes films, equipment and activities supplied by service clubs and other safety-minded groups. McDonald's Restaurants also run bicycle safety clinics in co-operation with local police, he said.

"I'll get to show children how to operate their bicycles safely, even though they can probably ride circles around me," he said with a laugh.

He also plans safety poster contests, to get the children involved in safety programs.

Mini-bikes, although not a major safety hazard on the road, are also of concern, he added, and he hopes to get both children and parents involved in seminars on mini-bike safety.
