# Heart fund over top

The Canadian Heart Fund, Ontario Division, reached its \$7.7 million campaign objective in 1982 in exceeding its goal by \$39,022.

Door-to-door canvassing, special events, corporate donations and the sale of 'Roses for Research,' in Feburary all contributed to the final total of \$7,739,022.88.

Bequests and other sources of income combined with campaign receipts will allow the Ontario Heart Foundation to allocate \$9,250,000 to heart disease and stroke research in Ontario, for the 1982-83 granting period.

Alex D. Broomfield, 1982 Canadian Heart Fund chairman said, "evidence to date, that research has paid off, is in the fact that the overall death rate from heart and blood vessel diseases, for people under 65 years of age, is down 27 per cent since 1953. Marked reductions have been achieved in deaths due to stroke. In heart attack, the single leading cause of deathin Canada, the decline has only been 11 per cent."

## Trees available

This summer, the Halton Region Conservation Authority is accepting applications for the private lands reforestation assistance program, directed to the rural areas of the watershed. The program is designed to do these things:

1. Reforest poor quality agricultural lands.

Develop windbreak protection along fence rows and laneways.

Provide erosion control along stream banks and creek valleys.

Through nursery stock application forms obtained from either the Ministry of Natural Resources or the Halton Region Conservation Authority, seedlings may be purchased. Hardwood and conferous seedlings are available.

The trees are 2½ cents each and if planting assistance is required, the Conservation Authority will charge a nominal fee. The Authority will plant a minimum of 1,000 trees to a maximum of 20,000 trees per property per year. They ask that enquiries about this program be made no later than August 31.
