



Rural residents complain district about trap shooting noise







In addition to looking at the zoning compliance of trap clubs in Milton's rural areas, council also approved motions to have staff look at the feasibility of a no discharge of firearms law for the Town and of minimum space requirements for such clubs.

"We need some standards so that some guy on a half acre in Omagh or Molfatt can't open up a trap shoot tomorrow without us having some authority to close him down," said Milton Ward I Councillor Rick Day.
