21 dogs destroyed in June

Seems dogs like to wander in June. Last month 55 dogs were impounded at the Halton Hills Animal Control Centre, the highest number of any month this year.

Owners reclaimed 29 dogs, while 21 were destroyed or sent for research and five were placed in new homes.

The animal control officers answered 279 calls in June.

A total of 2,408 licences have been issued during the first six months of the year, compared to 2,599 last year.

Three phases for proposal

A \$1-lot subdivision proposal on Highway 7 just east of Acton has been given a provisional go-ahead by Halton's Planning and Public Works Committee.

The plan, which has been around for six years, had originally received approval in 1977, but the three-year approval time had lapsed before the plan had been registered.

To complicate things further, Planning staff at Halton Region were considering refusal of the proposal because

planning policies regarding estate lots have changed.

"The proposal, if considered as a new application, could not be recommended for approval (under the new policy)," a planning report stated. New policies restrict estate development to 20 lots.
