**15 Sideroad deplorable - Sheldon**

"In all the years I've been a rural resident I've never seen a road in such deplorable condition as 15 Sideroad all the way through," Councillor Pam Sheldon told Halton Hills council, Monday night.

She said there are great deep ditches, loose gravel and broken spools, and contended there are three dangerous spots east of Highway 25.

Sheldon said she wanted something done before the school buses come down the road. Acknowledging 15 Sideroad is a regional road, Sheldon urged the regional representatives to make a little noise, in order to get something done.

**Consider more road calcium**

A request by Councillor Russ Miller to have additional calcium spread on rural roads in certain spots, such as in front of houses rather than all along the roads, will be referred to next year's budget committee.

Miller also suggested bags of calcium by purchased and given to rural residents to spread in front of their homes to keep down dust.

Engineer Bob Austen said the bagging practice was carried out in some smaller municipalities. "But sometimes it got up the lane and behind the barn." He noted the cost of taking bags out to the public could not be justified, and neither could the cost of going back to roads after one application to do spot work. "We are out of money in that budget by the end of next week," commented the engineer.

He pointed out if the budget is upped he could do anything council wants.

**Complaints about road**

The homeowners along 22 Sideroad between Concession 1 and 2 are unhappy with the condition of the road.

Councillor Pam Sheldon presented a petition with 24 signatures to Halton Hills council, Monday night.

Sheldon said passing a grader over the roads does nothing, so she asked the petition be forwarded to the budget committee for preliminary engineering in 1983.

**Rabid animals are a hazard this year.**

Rabies, which is spread by infected animals, continues to be a serious problem in Ontario. It is of special concern in built up areas where domestic and wild animals can infect children who come in contact with them. Children should be warned to avoid stray pets, as well as wild animals, especially if they appear sick or friendly because these usually are signs that they are rabid.

Pets should be regularly vaccinated, leashed, and kept indoors at night. You can help to control rabies by reporting to your local police, humane society or health unit any pets or wild animals which are acting strangely.

Do not handle your pet with bare hands immediately after it has fought with a rabid animal. Do not touch dead animals. Seek advice from a veterinarian. Contact your doctor or health unit immediately if your child or pet comes in contact with wild animals.
