Need BIA arcade comments in writing

While the Acton and Georgetown Business Improvement Area (BIA) boards have made verbal comments on the idea of the municipality allowing arcades to only locate in the BIAs, Halton Hills council wants a written response.

Councillor Ross Knechtel reported he contacted BIA officials in Acton and received a "yes and no answer." He added the Town can only assume the Acton BIA won't oppose the change to the arcade bylaw.

Councillor John McDonald talked with Georgetown BIA officials and they don't want to restrict the type of businesses which locate downtown, but they did express concerns about loitering and noise problems if there

arcades could locate would automatically expand too. Mayor Peter Pomeroy suggested future councils might not want the area where arcades could locate automatically expanded. Pomeroy concluded the Town needs the BIA boards' positions in writing.
