





Farmstead Program is

extended Guidelines for the recently announced Farmstead Improvement Program have

been extended.

The grant program runs until December 31, 1982 and is for specific farmstead projects. A 50 per cent grant with a \$2,000 maximum available. Since it is an employment creation program the hired labor cost will determine the level of grant available.

Under the expanded guidelines, lightning troughing. rods, soffits and fascia, qualify on a new or replacement Doors and windows qualify on a repair or replacement basis in buildings. existing Where material for a project was bought before May 13, 1982, only the labour cost of a project will be eligible

farming Farmers exclusively on leased lands are not eligible to apply unless the land is from leased Province of Ontario.

Complete cetails and application forms are available at any Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food Office.


