

New Town facilities superintendent is into all sports for all seasons

Alan Hay is into sports—all sports, in all seasons. He feels this important contact with the real world will help him to be a good Superintendent of Facilities for Halton Hills.

Hay took charge of this new post on the Town staff August 3, and has spent much of his time orienting himself to the facilities in town. He will be in charge of all facilities, including arenas, community centres and playing fields.

Growing up in Toronto, Hay, 31, worked in arenas for 12 years in Mississauga and Scarborough before deciding to go to Seneca College in 1976. Two years and a diploma in Recreation Facilities Management later, Hay started work for the Township of Kingston. (Not to be confused with the city of Kingston).

Because the staff was small (only three people for 27,000 population), he found himself working in all departments getting to know all areas of recreation.

During his four years in the Kingston area, Hay completed a Principles of Management course at the University of Guelph, and received a Certificate of Qualification from the Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations and an Interim Municipal Recreation Director's Certificate from the Ministry of Culture and Recreation.

Once he's settled in Acton with his wife and two young daughters, Hay says he plans to get involved in as many sports as possible. He is a referee and umpire, plays baseball, hockey, and golf. "If there's a sport, I'll play it," he laughs.
