Residents want overnight parking on 17 streets

The number of streets in Acton where at least one resident wants overnight parking has swelled to 17.

Councillor Dave Whiting reports he received calls from residents on Wilbur St., Wellington St., Maria St. and Peel St. this week requesting their roads be exempted from the three hour overnight parking limit.

Previously Whiting had heard from residents on Elmore Dr., Lakeview St., Poplar Ave., Eastern

Ave., Lake Ave., John St., McDonald Blvd., Churchill Rd. South, Kingham Rd., Greenore Cres., Mowbray Pl., Longfield Rd. and Acton Blvd., wanting overnight parking.

He has had two calls from residents who don't want overnight parking allowed, Acton Blvd. and Elmore Dr.

For a number of streets he has received calls from more than one resident.

After council decided to reject his motion of having the overnight parking laws in effect only between November and April, Whiting followed up on engineer Robert Austin's suggestion that certain streets were not having overnight parking is a real problem could be exempted from the bylaw.

Whiting said he will be submitting the list to Austin this week so a report for council can be prepared.

October 7 skins theft hearing set

Five men charged in the theft of skins from Beardmore will face a preliminary hearing October 7 in Milton Provincial Court.

Mark Gourlay, 25, of 25 Main St. N., John Jordan, 27, 24 Ransom St., Allen Doley, 34, formerly of Church St., now of Bracebridge, and David Hall, 37, 243 Mill St., are all charged with theft over \$200 and conspiracy. A fifth man, Nick Marino, owner of a Toronto shoe repair shop has been charged with conspiracy.

The men appeared in court Monday morning, to set a date for the hearing, their fifth appearance since being charged last spring. Proceedings have been held up while one of the accused engaged a lawyer.

Jerry Henry

A former Inspector for the Region of Halton, William Gerald "Jerry" Henry, died August 1 following a lengthy illness.

Mr. Henry of 27 Brock St., was born December 2, 1911 in Long Branch, Ontario, the son of William John Henry and Mary Tomlinson. He attended public and high schools at Long Branch.

He served with the RCNVR during World War II and married Doris Alleen on March 9, 1943 in Toronto. The couple moved to Acton 29 years ago, residing for the past six years at their Brock St. home. Mr. Henry retired from the region in 1978 and worked part-time at the Sheriff's Office as a Court Constable.

Left to mourn his loss are his wife, and two sons, Ron of Acton and Bill of Balmertown. He was predeceased by his sister Edna.

Funeral service was held August 3 in Acton with Rev. A. Tribe officiating. Interment was at Fairview Cemetery. Pallbearers were Don Perry, Aldo Braids, Mackenzie, Ken McIsaac, Bob McArthur and Len Loyell, all of Acton.
