

### Complaint lodged over noise at Yugoslavs' picnic

A complaint was registered with the Halton Regional Police Sunday evening about noise coming from the Yugoslav Centre on Highway 25 south of Acton.  
Recently Halton Hills council decided it would support liquor permit applications for the Yugoslavs but on the condition that no public

address system was used. Rather than cancel the picnic, the organizers went ahead with the public address system but without the liquor permit.  
Neighbor on the Third Line, Gerry Brockelsby, said in an interview that he called the police to lodge a complaint about the noise but didn't have a noise bylaw violation charge laid. There was loud public address announcements and amplified live

music on Sunday afternoon and into the evening. He said he filed the complaint to have it on the record.  
Brockelsby and another neighbor, William McArthur, said the music could easily be heard in their yards and with the windows open inside the house too. They said it wasn't as loud as last year, but couldn't compare it with other Sundays this summer.

### New phone cables

Bell Canada is currently installing the first fibre optic cables in Acton, with a planned operation deadline of December.

Bell spokesman Bill Salmon told the Acton Free Press the new cables will serve the long distance trunk line between Guelph and Toronto. Acton callers telephoning Toronto will have their signals going through the cable as Acton calls are re-routed to Guelph before transmission to Toronto.

The cable is made of glass, a renewable resource, and will be replacing the old copper cables, a non-renewable resource, Salmon explained. It is also much smaller. A 1/2 inch cable will carry the same number of signals as four, two inch cables.

While the Acton cables will be underground, they will surface in Rockwood where they will become aerial, Salmon said.

### More windows broken

A 16-year-old Acton resident has been charged with mischief in connection with a window-breaking incident at First Line TV over the Civic Holiday weekend.

The youth was observed throwing a rock at the front window of the store on Sunday, Aug. 1.

Last weekend Robert Little School and Acton Library were both hit by vandals who broke windows. Three males were seen running away from the school, leaving behind \$800 in damage. Two windows at the library were also broken, with damage estimated at \$250.
