**Income Tax Course Begins Soon**

**Youth Unemployment**

Out of work and looking for some quick cash, or perhaps over your head in debt? Those unfortunately turning to crime to find some easy money are not robbing banks or holding up local business proprietors.  
According to Halton Regional Police, the biggest crime going is fraud—be it credit card theft, forged or bad cheques etc. Running a close second is shoplifting.  
Fraud alone, which covers forgery, impersonation, credit card abuse and writing bad cheques, have risen a startling 25 per cent over last year's reported number of cases.  
A total of 927 fraud-related crimes in Halton were reported last year compared to 738 in 1980 and 816 in 1979.  
And, it is not just the careless bookkeeper, or the desperate man who partakes in this form of crime. The number of juvenile offenders are increasing and it is not uncommon to find a 12-year-old who has mastered the art of forgery, according to police.  
Shoplifting is showing a similar rise, with 967 incidents reported in Halton last year, compared to 789 in 1980 and 742 in 1979.  
House and business break and enter cases on the other hand, have shown only a minute increase (1.4 per cent) over the previous year.  
There were 2,539 cases reported in 1981, only 25 more than in 1980.  
This is in sharp contrast however to other regions such as Hamilton-Wentworth, Peel and

**No work leads to crime**  
Special Report  
A total of 536 incidents were reported compared to 353 in 1980.  
Police believe, however, this number is partly due to the efforts of the Region's new drug squad which came into effect last year.  
The total number of overall crime offences committed by adults (16 years and over) was 27,358 or 5.6 per cent more than in 1980 when 25,902 cases were reported.  
Juvenile crime in Halton rose from 5,873 in 1980 to 6,038 in 1981.  
Mischievous and vandalism are among the more popular forms of juvenile crime.  
The number of cases in District 1 (Milton, Georgetown, Acton) in that category alone rose 67 per cent over the previous year.  
"It is an indication of kids striking out at society," said Sgt. Peter Whittaker, head of crime prevention for Halton.  
Break and enter offences for this area rose 12 per cent—64 in 1981 compared to 57 in 1980.  
Teenagers and alcohol are proving a bad mix with a 34 per cent increase in the number of alcohol-related offences committed by juveniles.  
Halton Regional Police recorded 43 incidents last year in District 1, compared to 32 the previous year.  
Drugs and related offences have shown a downward trend for the last year, with only 13 cases reported. In 1980 there were 22.  
Shoplifting in this district has shown an alarming increase, double the number in 1980.  
Juveniles apprehended in shoplifting in 1981 totalled 87.
