Air essential for operation

Don't cut off your air supply when you cut down your home fuel bill. That's something you should keep in mind when preparing for this year's heating season.

Whether a home is heated with oil, gas or solid fuel such as wood, a furnace needs fresh air to function properly.

When a furnace is working, it takes oxygen and releases

carbon dioxide. If a furnace can not get all the oxygen it requires, it could start producing carbon monoxide as well. Both carbon dioxide and carbon monoxide can be dangerous if they're allowed to build up. These gases must be released from the home and replaced by fresh air.

A brochure prepared

by Esso Petroleum lists possible problem areas: a furnace enclosed in a small room or cupboard; water dripping at the chimney clean-out doors may indicate a blocked chimney; a chimney cap with small openings can restrict the escape of gases; white powder or stains on masonry chimney bricks may indicate disintegration of chimney; and moisture or ice buildup on the inside of double or triple glazed windows may indicate over-sealing.
