

Burlington's Bill Priestner supported the meetings, televised saying it was a way of letting the public see exactly what goes on at the meetings, especially at budget time, "The public made it perfectly clear to us this past spring that we are spending too much money." Georgetown representatives Betty Fisher said she was in favor of televising meetings only if it was at no cost to the taxpayers. She stated the Oakville and Burlington council meetings are televised and they did not have to pay anything for the instaliation of equipment.

She told the board they have to look at the fact not everyone has cable television in their homes. She will not support the expenditure of any money, but did support the trial run.

Milton and Halton Hills separate school representative John Bradley also WAS against spending money. "We have even had to cut out coffee and biscuits," he guipped referring to the board now charging refreshments at the bimonthly meetings.


Milton trustee Lawson joined the ranks of those not supporting the idea because of the costs recently spent on "communication vice" which is reaching all the homes (a newsletter from the board).
